Lake George Drainage Registration Goat Hunts Close

Anchorage – Registration permit hunts RG869 for mountain goats in the Lake George area will close at one minute before midnight on October 12, 2011 by emergency order of the Alaska Department of Fish and Game. Anchorage area wildlife biologist Jessy Coltrane said 20 mountain goat units have been harvested from the Lake George Area out of a quota of 21 goat units, and additional hunters are currently in the field. Total goat units are calculated using one unit for billies and two units for nannies. The take of no more than 21 goat units is consistent with the goal of maintaining appropriate population levels in this hunt area. Since the harvest quota has been met for the Lake George area, no registration permits will be issued for RG864 this year.

All other goat hunts in Unit 14C are unaffected by the emergency order.
