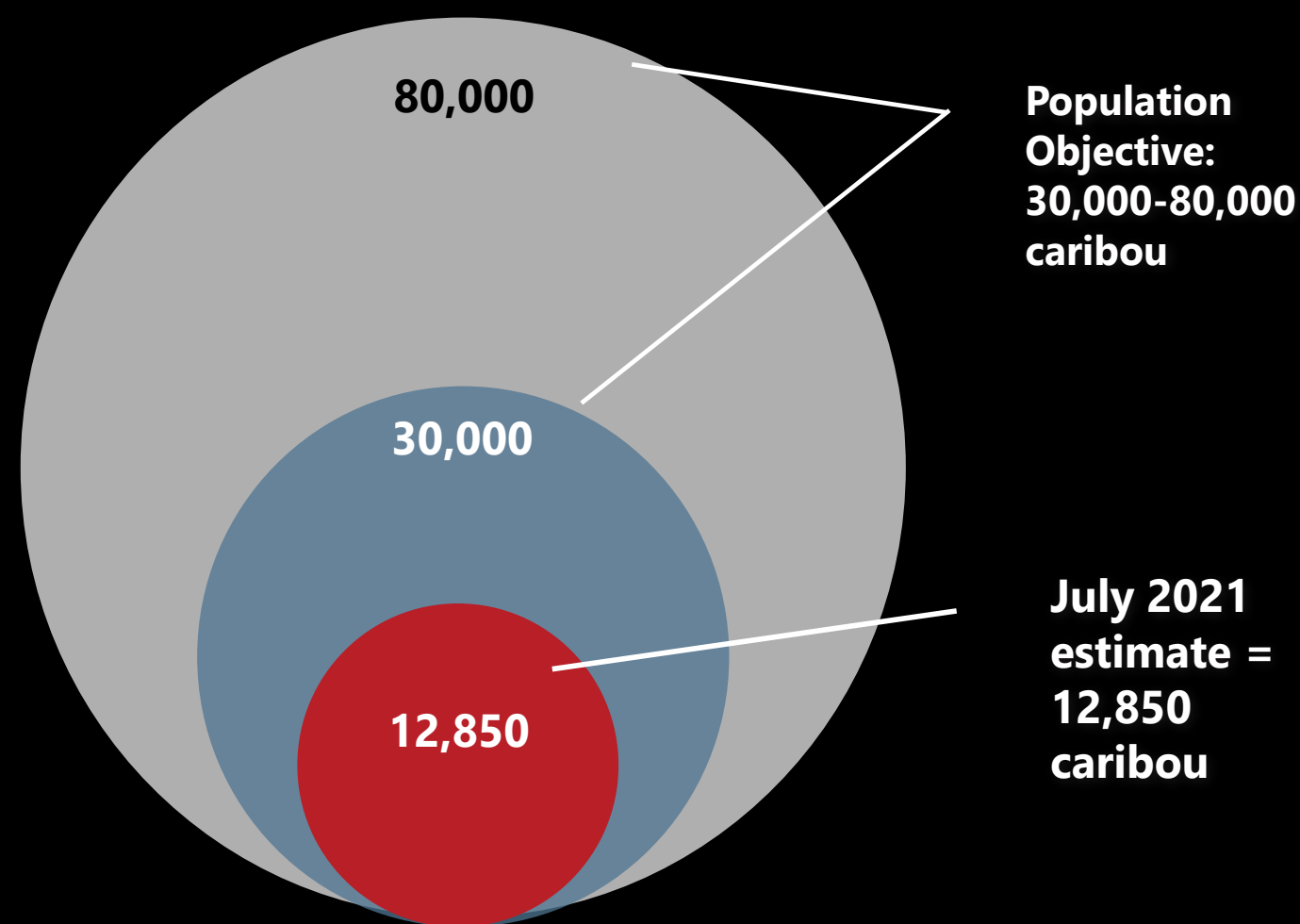
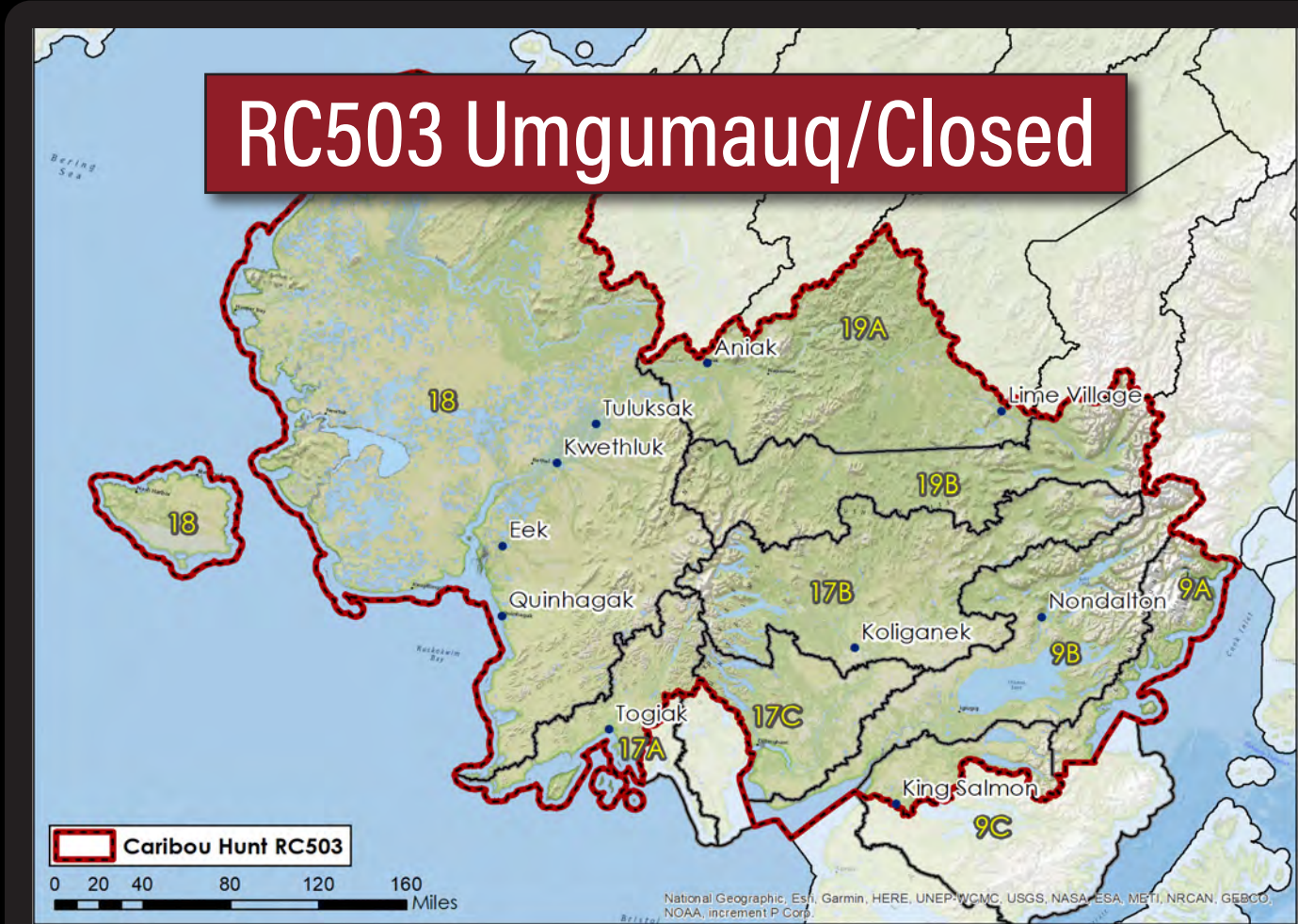


# ATAM Tuntunek Pisuutulit: RC503 Umgumauq

The 2021 population estimate was 12,850 caribou, well below the objective of 30,000–80,000 animals.

Biologists are conducting research and working with local communities to understand reasons for the decline.
