Colton Lipka gave us a quick summary of the estimated goals for the 2023 season and run projections.

Kasilof and Ninilchik is open to bait due to hatcher fish. Wild run at Crooked Creek goal is 700 to 1300 fish. Question was asked by AC Member Dyer. As the state has always managed fisheries on wild stock not hatchery stock.

Discussion about regulation and use of bait being open and two hooks right now. This was confirmed by Colton that bait is currently open January 1st to September 15<sup>th</sup> with multiple hooks (2) above the sterling highway bridge.

Discussion on possible AC Proposals due April 10th

Monte - Paired Restrictions for August Bait

If the king salmon season is \_\_\_\_\_ at the end of July 31st.

Retention - Bait August 1st

Catch & Release – Commercial 24 hrs | No Bait till August 7<sup>th</sup> below Soldotna bridge no bait till the 15<sup>th</sup> above the bridge, anchored boat or shore.

Closed – No Bait till the 15th of August single hook from the lake down
