5 AAC 92.050. Required permit hunt conditions and procedures.(a) The following conditions and procedures for permit issuance apply to each permit hunt:

(I) no more than one Unit 13 Tier I subsistence permit for caribou may be issued per household every four regulatory years; [THE HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD, AS DEFINED IN 5 AAC 92.071(B), AND ANY MEMBER OF THE HOUSEHOLD OBTAINING A UNIT 13 TIER I SUBSISTENCE PERMIT IN A REGULATORY YEAR FOR CARIBOU MAY NOT HUNT CARIBOU OR MOOSE IN ANY OTHER LOCATION IN THE STATE DURING THAT REGULATORY YEAR.]
