









Birchwood Management Area, Hunter/Knik, and Peters Creek Antlerless Moose Hunts




Current Regulations

Unit 14(C), that portion known as the Anchorage Management Area:

1 antlerless moose by drawing permit only, and by bow and arrow, shotgun, or muzzleloader only; up to 50 permits may be issued





Ground-based Surveys

During 2014, two ground based surveys were conducted, using teams of observers walking trails.

February 26: Approximately 60% of the park was

covered;

4 moose counted, estimated 7 moose

November 6: Approximately 70% of the park was

covered;

10 moose counted, estimated 14 moose

Poor Winter Habitat

Moose abundance appears to vary within the park seasonally

During both surveys (conducted during winter), moose abundance in the park seemed to be greatly reduced from summer

During winter, moose likely move into surrounding neighborhoods in order to find sufficient forage





Unit 14C Dall Sheep Harvest and Population Count



- Since 2009 population > 1000 sheep
- 2014 minimum count: 1062 sheep
- Archery hunts have low success rate
 - 2010: 0 ewes, 2 rams harvested (2% success rate)
 - 2011: 3 ewes, 3 rams harvested (7% success rate)
 - 2012: 0 sheep harvested (0% success rate)
 - 2013: 1 ewe, 7 rams harvested (7% success rate)
 - 2014: 1 ewe, 2 rams harvested (13% success rate)

Since 1993: total harvest of sheep has averaged 3% of total population.



Dall Sheep Permits

Current Permit Allocation

2014: 45 resident, 8 nonresident rifle permits
 81 resident, 4 nonresident archery permits

Under the Requested Scenario:

- 1 out of 8 (13%) rifle permits
- 1 out of 4 (25%) archery permits
- Remaining nonresident permits would go to guided hunters only

2004-2013: 26% of non-resident hunters indicated they were not guided.






