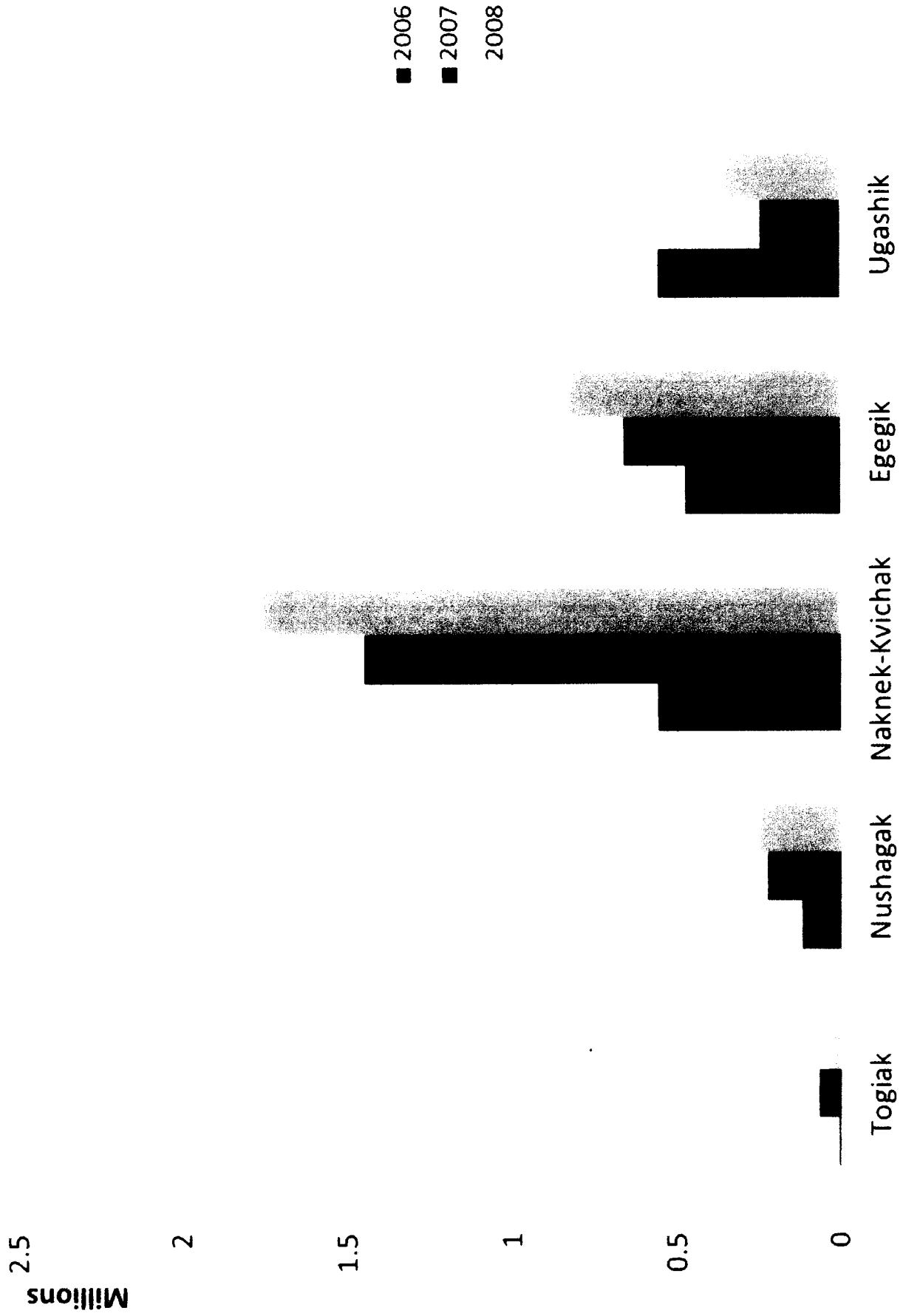
# **No fishery harvests a single stock**

- **Like on the North Peninsula in Bristol Bay stocks are mixed in the fishing districts consequently mixed stock harvest is unavoidable and OK**

# How Much

- As much as 22% of a single river systems harvestable fish are harvested in other Bristol Bay districts. 22% is a small enough % it doesn't cause a problem for management or escapement.

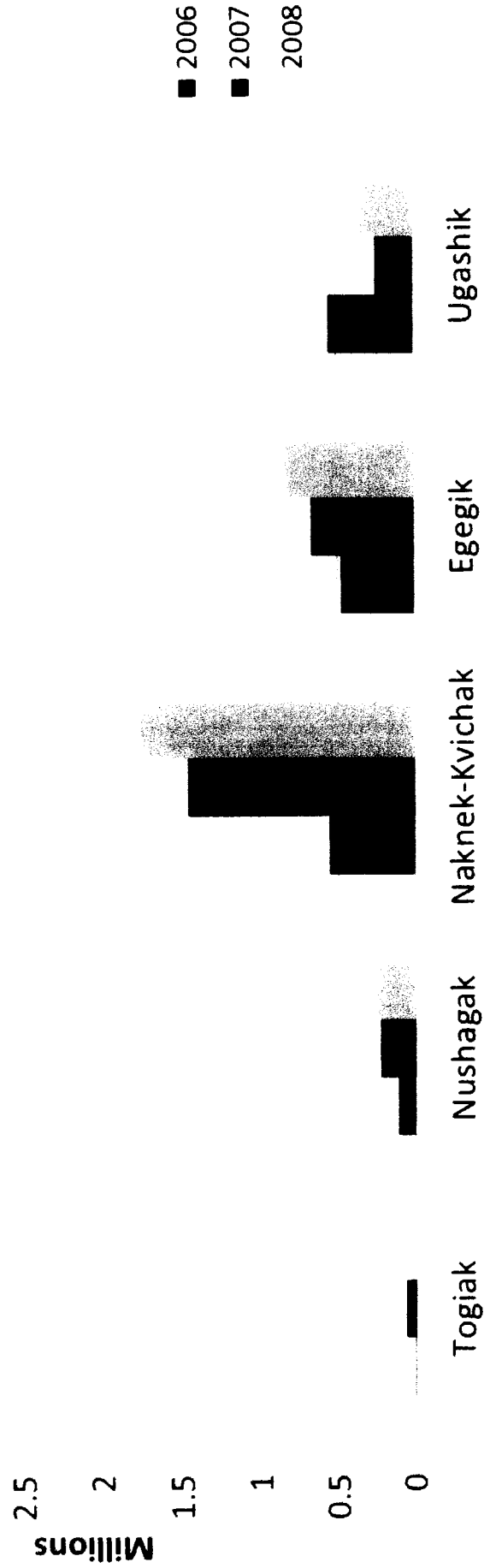
# Bristol Bay Sockeye Harvested Outside Their Own District

# Where are the fish harvested

- Ugashik fish are harvested in Egigik, Naknek/Kvichak and the Nushigak districts as well as in Ugashik
- Egigik fish in Ugashik and Naknek/Kvichak
- Naknek fish in Egigik and Ugashik
- Kvichak fish in Egigik, Ugashik and Nushugak
- Wood and Nushigak river fish in Egigik, Naknek/Kvichak and Ugashik
- Togiak fish in Nushigak

# The WASSIP years

- During WASSIP study years significant numbers of fish were harvested out of district
- 2006-1, 709518
- 2007-2, 643,790
- 2008-3, 233,327



# Comparing Bristol Bay and Peninsula

- Bristol Bay like the North Peninsula harvests fish where they are available
- Unlike Bristol Bay the North Peninsula doesn't have bays or river mouths consequently the districts are large and stocks are mixed in the district
- Management has evolved so we safeguard escapement and maximize harvest
