MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS (RC #104):

1. Board-generated Proposal Policy (comments in RC #76): The board determined it was best to wait until the Joint Board meeting scheduled for October 2013 to have a full discussion on the criteria which is within the current call of the Joint Board meeting (confirmed by Department of Law). The Board of Fisheries will use this draft policy in the interim.

Board Member Kluberton, Chair of the Board of Fish/Board of Game committee, will take the lead in this charge. Executive Director Wellard will work with Executive Director Tibbles to develop the proper legal notice for the Joint Board meeting to include this topic, provide an opportunity for the public to submit comments on the Boardgenerated Proposal Criteria, and to ensure that the Board of Game comments are included.

- 2. Emergency Petition Prince William Sound commercial spot shrimp fishery (RC #19): The board determined the Emergency Petition contained in RC #19 did not meet the emergency petition criteria and the petition failed with a vote of 0-7.
- 3. Repeal of board's regulations for guiding principles for groundfish fishery regulations (RC #94): The department clarified that the board has repealed the applicability of the guiding principles in several areas and the board's intent is to ultimately repeal the entire regulation, but that there are some areas where the regulation still applies. The regulation is a board policy and only impacts the board, and not necessarily any public interest. The board passed the board-generated proposal A contained in RC #94 with a vote of 7-0.
- 4. Update on Cordova meeting logistics for the 2014/2015 Prince William Sound and Upper Copper/Upper Susitna Finfish meeting: Executive Director Wellard provided the board with an update of her meeting site visit to Cordova which confirmed the community has acceptable meeting facilities. The board had no objection to keep Cordova as a meeting location for the Prince William Sound and Upper Copper/Upper Susitna Finfish meeting scheduled for December 3-8, 2014.
- 5. Request of board to write NPFMC asking for lower bycatch limits by trawl fisheries: The board discussed the accuracy of the content of RC 80 and timing of a letter in relationship to Joint Protocol Committee meetings. Without objection from the board, Executive Director Wellard will work with Executive Director Olive, NPFMC, to ensure this item is added to the Joint Protocol committee meeting agenda scheduled for June 12, 2013.
- 6. Discussion on re-establishing the Sustainable Salmon Fisheries Policy (SSFP) committee: The board agreed it is appropriate to re-establish the SSFP committee due to several concerns that arose during the course of the Statewide Finfish meeting and assign members to this committee during the 2014 Board of Fisheries Work Session. Members who are assigned will be tasked with developing sideboards of the scope of this committee with the department's assistance.
