Recommend the Board to take **NO ACTION on Proposal 29 & 32** – opening access to Coghill Lake sockeye to the seine fleet.

- Regarding the occasional large runs to Coghill Lake, the department has EO authority to allow access to seiners before July 21st. This EO authority has been exercised in the past, as seen in the below graph.
- The department announced the 2014 5-year rolling average harvest between seiners and gillnetters is 55.4% / 44.6% respectively. The goal is a 50/50 split. The seine group is not in need of additional allocation.
- This would reallocate salmon harvest from the drift gillnet to the purse seine fleet; reopening the
 allocation plan. The allocation plan has undergone many changes since 1960 where districts have changed
 gear groups for various reasons (including hatchery production).
