Southeast Alaska Dungeness Crab Non-commercial Overview

- User groups
 - Sport
 - Residents and nonresidents
 - Personal Use
 - Residents only
 - Subsistence
 - Residents only



Southeast Alaska Dungeness Crab Non-commercial Management

- All user groups
 - Males only
 - 6 1/2 –inch minimum carapace width
 - Open year-round unless closed by EO
- Sport
 - 4 pots/10 ring nets per person
 - 10 pots/20 ring nets per vessel
 - Daily bag and possession limits
 - 3 legal males




Southeast Alaska Dungeness Crab Non-commercial Management

- Personal Use/Subsistence
 - 5 pots/10 ring nets per person
 - 10 pots/20 ring nets per vessel
 - Daily bag and possession limits:
 - 20 legal males

Southeast Alaska Dungeness Crab Non-commercial Proposals

- Proposals with potential subsistence/personal use implications
 - Proposals 70–79: Closed waters*
- Sport
 - Proposals 80 and 81: Ecotourism



* Proposals 76 and 77 concern waters within the Juneau Nonsubsistence Area

Southeast Alaska Dungeness Crab Non-commercial Proposals

- Communities near proposed closed waters
 - Hydaburg (Proposal 70)
 - Whale Pass (Proposal 71)
 - Petersburg (Proposals 72 and 73)
 - Sitka (Proposal 74)
 - Angoon (Proposal 75)
 - Hoonah (Proposal 78)
 - Haines (Proposal 79)



Southeast Alaska Dungeness Crab Subsistence Fisheries

- Primarily Dungeness crab targeted
- Historical records indicate continual use of crab since 1800s
- Methods—historical: digging sticks, spears
- Methods contemporary: pots, rings, digging implements, removal from commercial catches



Southeast Alaska Dungeness Crab Subsistence Fisheries

- Harvest most common in spring through fall
- Eaten fresh, frozen, and canned
- High use and sharing rates




Southeast Alaska Dungeness Crab Non-commercial Harvests

- Two sources of harvest data
 - Statewide harvest survey
 - Household harvest surveys
- Comprehensive household surveys in 2012 and 2013*
- All crab used in the home personal use, subsistence, sport, removed from commercial catches
- Maps of harvest areas can be found in staff comments, RC 1





Composition of resource harvests






Composition of harvests: Marine invertebrates






Use and harvest of Dungeness crab






Sharing of Dungeness crab

Dungeness crab harvest estimates by community



Percent of residents noting 2012 marine invertebrate use as less, same, or more compared to recent years


