The board approved the Division of Sport Fish's request to use rotenone for northern pike eradication efforts in Kashwitna Pit, just north of Willow, Alaska. In accordance with Alaska Statute 16.35.200, ADF&G must receive approval from the board to use a poison, rotenone, to eradicate predatory species.
