


- Allowing take of grizzlies introduced use of bear baiting stations in this area
- Represents unforeseen consequence of increasing take for wolves when most vulnerable (during pregnancy and whelping), resulting in loss of reproductive capacity for packs
 - Especially important during this period of prolonged low densities
- Although not primarily allocative in nature, this unforeseen additional risk represents a decrease in allocation to both trappers and wolf viewers


