What is the issue you would like the board to address and why? The current regulations in Unit 15B, adopted in March 2019, are confusing to the hunting public because of the differences in season dates and legal animals, which results in lost opportunity. When the existing regulations were passed to remove the drawing permit and institute general season harvest ticket hunts across Unit 15B and align regulations in the previous permit areas with the rest of Unit 15B three unintentional discrepancies occurred. No bow season was established in the old permit area to match the current season dates already present in the remainder of Unit 15B; spike antlered bull moose were not listed as an animal legal for harvest; and the general season dates in the old permit area remained five days shorter than the general season throughout the rest of Unit 15. If this problem is not addressed confusion will continue to exist surrounding moose harvest regulations in Unit 15B, an increase in illegal harvest will likely occur, and legal harvest opportunity that is biologically sustainable will be missed.

These differences have caused confusion for moose hunters and there are no biological concerns for the moose population in the areas. The area in question was previously managed under a drawing permit. Habitat conditions improved significantly due to wildfire activity benefitting moose. This portion of 15B can support the additional harvest that is likely to occur by having season dates and bag limits aligned with 15B remainder.
