

**Findings for the Alaska Board of Game  
2024-233-BOG  
Board Recommendation to the Department of Fish and Game  
provided during the Interior and Northeast Arctic Region Regulations Meeting**

The Board of Game finds as follows, based on information provided by Department staff, Alaska residents and other wildlife users:

When multiple antlerless hunts that share the same geographic area are in place within Unit 20D, and sufficient harvestable surplus does not exist to hold all hunts with an antlerless component, the Department needs allocative guidance regarding which antlerless hunts are the priority. Some hunt bag limits are entirely antlerless, while others include antlerless moose as a component of the bag limit.

The Board recommended the department take the following actions, when insufficient harvestable surplus exists to hold all hunts:

- Allocate 90 percent to youth drawing hunts (e.g. YM792);
- Allocate 10 percent to the antlerless component of the Veteran's hunts (e.g. DM795);
- If harvestable surplus is sufficient to issue more than 110 permits, then the other antlerless hunts will be held.
