

Resolution of the Alaska Board of Game

WHEREAS, the Board of Game (BOG) is charged with the conservation and development of the wildlife resources of the state; and


WHEREAS, moose management techniques to detect changes in both moose population status and composition have improved dramatically since passage of the bill in 1975 requiring annual reauthorization of antlerless moose hunts; and

WHEREAS, when there has been a need to adjust or eliminate an antlerless moose hunt, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (department) has come to the BOG or taken Emergency Action; and

WHEREAS, reviewing cow moose seasons on an annual basis is time-consuming and costly to the department, the BOG, Advisory Committees and the public;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Alaska Board of Game finds that SB325 addresses the above concerns and we do thereby support this bill.
