### EXPLANATION:

This emergency order opens Ketchikan Creek to sport fishing from August 30 through December 31, 2011. It allows a bag and possession limit of four king salmon of any size. The bag and possession limit for all other salmon 16 inches or greater in length is two per day in combination, and two in possession. Only single hook, unbaited, artificial lures may be used. This emergency order is effective at 12:01 a.m. Tuesday, August 30, 2011 through 11:59 p.m. December 31, 2011.

REGULATION: The provisions of 5 AAC 47.023(i)(6)(B) are superseded and (E) is added by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are in effect:

### **5 AAC 47.023. Special provisions for seasons, bag, possession, and size limits, and methods and means for the fresh waters of Southeast Alaska Area.**

(i) In the Ketchikan vicinity:

(6) in Ketchikan Creek

(B) sport fishing is allowed from August 30 through December 31, 2011.

(E) the bag and possession limit for king salmon is four fish, no size limit,

### JUSTIFICATION:

The Alaska Board of Fisheries granted the department emergency order authority to increase sport fish bag and possession limits when hatchery produced fish escape through existing fisheries to designated harvest areas in numbers that exceed brood stock needs or any natural spawning requirements. The hatchery has completed their king salmon egg take and has reached half of their coho salmon egg take goal. With 300 coho salmon currently in the hatchery raceway the coho salmon egg take goal is expected to be met. To date over 900 coho salmon have been harvested for cost recovery. The king and coho salmon present in Ketchikan Creek as of August 25 are in excess of broodstock and escapement requirements.
