### EXPLANATION:

This emergency order prohibits the retention of sockeye salmon while sport fishing in Larson Creek and within a ¼ mile radius of its confluence with the Talkeetna River, beginning 12:01 a.m., Saturday, August 9, 2014.

### REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 61.120. Special provisions and localized additions and exceptions to the seasons, bag, possession, and size limits, and methods and means for Unit 5 of the Susitna River Drainage Area. (4) are superseded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective, beginning 12:01 a.m., Saturday, August 9, 2014, through 11:59 p.m., Wednesday, December 31, 2014:

**5 AAC 61.120. Special provisions and localized additions and exceptions to the seasons, bag, possession, and size limits, and methods and means for Unit 5 of the Susitna River Drainage Area.**

(4) the Larson Creek drainage and all waters within one-quarter mile of its confluence with the Talkeetna River are closed to sport fishing for king salmon and the retention of sockeye salmon; sockeye salmon may not be retained or possessed and any sockeye salmon caught must be released immediately; the Larson Creek drainage upstream of an ADF&G regulatory marker located approximately one-quarter mile upstream of its confluence with the Talkeetna River is closed to sport fishing for all salmon;

**JUSTIFICATION:**

The sustainable escapement goal for sockeye salmon in Larson Creek is 15,000—50,000 fish based on a weir count. By August 6, approximately 76 percent of the run has historically passed upstream of the weir. The weir count through August 6 was 9,000 fish and the final run is projected to be 11,800. Based on historical run timing and current weir counts, the projected escapement is less than the escapement goal and prohibiting harvest of sockeye salmon in the Larson Creek drainage is warranted.
