<u>JUSTIFICATION:</u> The waters of Chatham Strait are closed to the retention of king salmon through June 14 to protect Southeast Alaska wild king salmon stocks. This action will allow opportunity for anglers to retain king salmon in the area and time when Alaska hatchery-produced king salmon are expected to be returning to Hidden Falls Hatchery.

PREVIOUS EMERGENCY ORDERS AFFECTED:

Emergency Order 1-KS-R-03-23 established resident and nonresident king salmon bag and possession limits and a nonresident king salmon annual limit in accordance with the *Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management Plan* and are not affected by this emergency order.

Emergency Order 1-KS-R-04-23 establishes areas and times when king salmon may not be retained in the vicinity of Haines, Skagway, Juneau, Sitka, Petersburg, Wrangell and Ketchikan. These actions were taken to reduce the harvest of Southeast Alaska wild king salmon stocks and meet objectives for king salmon management within the Pacific Salmon Treaty. These conservation measures remain in affect outside the area and times identified by this emergency order.
