June 9, 2021

This meeting of the Kuskokwim River Salmon Management Working Group was called to order at approximately 10:01 a.m. and adjourned at approximately 12:45 p.m. A quorum was established with 12 full voting members present. Fritz Charles (1st Member at Large) chaired the meeting.

AGENDA ITEMS

- **A.** USFWS/KRITFC UPDATE: Audio for this update begins at 12:20 Meeting Audio 06/09/21
 - a. Avery Hoffman (KRITFC) stated that the fish commission had examined data from the first two setnet opportunities (*see the Information Packet* 06/09/21 pages 5-8) and that drift net periods were scheduled for June 12 and 15. KRITFC and USFWS will evaluate data from these periods and assessment data to determine when/if additional drift periods should occur.
 - **b.** Mary Peltola (2nd Member At Large; KRITFC) stated it would probably be June 17 until harvest estimates were available for the June 15 drift period and for the group to stay tuned past that point for information on future openers.
- **B.** ADF&G MANAGEMENT ACTIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION: Audio begins at 15:32 Meeting Audio 06/09/21
 - a. Ben Mulligan (Deputy Commissioner, ADF&G) informed the Working Group that Kuskokwim Area Management Staff had been directed by the ADF&G Commissioner to manage fisheries on the entirety of the Kuskokwim River (including the waters within subsistence sections 1-3) in accordance with the Kuskokwim River Salmon Management Plan.
 - **b.** Nick Smith (ADF&G) informed the Working Group of his intentions to mirror the USFWS drift net openers set to take place on Saturday, June 12 and Tuesday, June 15 in subsistence sections 1-3.
- C. PEOPLE TO BE HEARD: Non-Working Group Members: Audio begins at 21:22 Meeting Audio 06/09/21
 - a. Jonathan Samuelson (KRITFC) asked Nick Smith (ADF&G) some clarifying questions about subsistence fishing in sections 4 and 5. Avery Hoffman (KRITFC) asked who could apply for the king salmon subsistence harvest permit. Mr. Smith replied that the permit was available to Alaska state residents.
 - b. Steven Alexie (Napaskiak) disagreed that anyone should be able to apply for the permit and stated that it would enable people from the lower river to fish in subsistence sections 4 and 5.
 - c. Jim Simon (KRITFC) asked Nick Smith if ADF&G had considered implementing an elder fishery (60 years plus) which is in the state management plan. Mr. Smith replied that it had been considered, but since the Chinook salmon run was projected to return within the bounds of escapement, the one fishing period per week option was most warranted.
 - d. There were some further comments regarding reservations of allowing all state residents to apply for a permit and participate in the fishery. Chris McDevitt (ADF&G Subsistence) clarified that when the permit was in place in 2018, 188 permits were issued and of those, 184 were issued to Kuskokwim River residents meaning there was not a large influx of state residents from other areas of the state participating in the fishery in 2018.

 - Subsistence Reports: Lowest River, ONC Inseason Subsistence Report, Lower River, Middle River, Upper River, Headwaters
 - o Lower River Reports
 - James Charles (Tuntutuliak, Downriver Elder) stated that the 100-yard boundary markers at the non-salmon spawning tributaries needed to be put in. He said that he had caught some lush, pike, and a few other non-salmon species.
 - Charlie Brown (Eek, Commercial Fishing) reported that he had fished Pailleq (pronounced Bythluk) Slough last week and that there was a misunderstanding between him and Federal Law Enforcement Officers but that it had been resolved. He did not catch any fish.

- Adolph Rupie (Tuntutuliak) reiterated what James Charles said about the 100-yard boundary markers needing to be placed in the non-salmon spawning tributaries.
- John Andrew (Kwethluk; Downriver Elder / YK Delta RAC) said that he did not participate in the June 5 setnet opener because the water remained high, Others that participated caught mostly sheefish and a few small kings. Kings were being caught mostly near the bottom of the nets. He said it was still early but looking promising.
- Mike Williams (Akiak; Lower River Subsistence) said that limited amounts of fishers participated in the first two openers. Fewer participated in the first opener due to high water with more going out for the second. The average catch in the first period was between 2-6 kings and one red salmon was caught. There were a few more fish caught in the second opener and the water continues to go down.
- ONC Inseason Subsistence Report
 - Jaden Andrew (ONC) presented the ONC Inseason Subsistence Report. Please see the Information Packet pages 3-4 for this presentation.
- Middle River
 - Walter Morgan (Lower Kalskag; Middle River Subsistence) reported that he had drifted 17 times and caught one sheefish and one chum. He said that fishing was difficult near Kalskag.
- Upper River
 - Ruby Egrass (Red Devil; Upriver Subsistence) stated that one person in Red Devil had caught a king and shared it with other people in the community. One other person had also caught a sheefish.
- > Headwaters
 - Daniel Esai (Nikolai; Headwaters) reported that no one was currently fishing in Nikolai and that the water levels had fluctuated from high-to-low and high again. He reiterated what John Andrew had said about the first king salmon in the river swimming deep. He said that he did not anticipate much fishing effort in the headwaters this year.
 - Kevin Whitworth (McGrath, Western Interior RAC) said that a few setnets had been put out near McGrath. He had heard that a few pike, sheefish, and humpback whitefish had been caught.
 Some people were out rod-and-reel fishing. The water has gotten lower but was starting to rise again.
- Inseason Harvest Report (ONC/KRITFC):
 - Katie Russel (ONC) presented information on the ONC/KRITFC Inseason Harvest Reports from the June 2 and 5 setnet periods. For further information on this presentation please refer to *pages 5-8 of the Information Packet and Meeting Audio 06/09/21, beginning at 1:13:20.*

This survey will shed light on the amount of effort in these areas during mainstem closures.
