July 7, 2021

This meeting of the Kuskokwim River Salmon Management Working Group was called to order at 10:02 a.m. and adjourned at approximately 11:30 a.m. A quorum for the purpose of making motions on fish management decisions was <u>not</u> established (only 6 full voting members plus 1 ADF&G representative present throughout the meeting). Therefore, this KRSMWG meeting was treated as an executive session. Barbara Carlson (Upriver Subsistence) and Mary Peltola (2nd Member at Large) co-chaired the meeting.

AGENDA ITEMS

- **A.** USFWS/KRITFC UPDATE: Audio for this update begins at 14:30 Meeting Audio 07/07/21
 - Boyd Bilhovde (USFWS) reported that USFWS, ADF&G, and KRITFC had good meetings last week. Mr. Blihovde gave an overview of plans for management actions in the YK Delta Refuge waters. He stated that the USFWS and KRITFC commissioners were fairly comfortable with the conservation actions in place for Chinook salmon at this time which has given some overlapping protections for chum salmon. There are ongoing discussions about chum salmon conservation procedures. He stated that there needed to be discussions about what to do with the openings above the Kalskag line. He stated that he was considering rescinding the second special action to close the Kalskag line on up to the Refuge boundary so that there was not the appearance of unfairness along the river. He said he was happy for the red salmon return.
 - Barbara Carlson (Upriver Subsistence) questioned Mr. Blihovde about the special action procedures to clarify which salmon species were included in the special action. Mr. Blihovde confirmed that currently the special action was for Chinook salmon only and that there had not been anything issued for chum salmon from the USFWS.
- A. ADF&G MANAGEMENT ACTIONS UNDER CONSIDERATION: Audio begins at 20:25 Meeting Audio 07/07/21
 - Nick Smith (ADF&G) gave a summary of the current management actions in place. For this meeting there were no additional subsistence restrictions under consideration. He informed the group that a catcher/seller wanted to operate this summer with a commissioners dipnet permit to catch sockeye. This would allow the catcher/seller to operate commercially and release any kings or chum salmon captured.

 - Boyd Blihovde (USFWS) asked Katie Russel (ONC) about harvest goals and if people had chum salmon goals. She said yes, but that there were so few chums that it was difficult for people to put a percentage point on their goals.
 - There was further discussion about subsistence harvest goals being met between Avery Hoffman (KRITFC), Katie Russel (ONC), Barbara Carlson (Upriver Subsistence), Boyd Blihovde (USFWS), and Jim Simon (KRITFC) please refer to meeting audio for more on this discussion.
 - Lower River
 - Albert Kawagley (Bethel; 1st Member at Large) said that he fished below Akiachak during the last opening and caught 47 reds, 6 kings, and no chums. He noticed that there were not that many other people out fishing.
 - Mike Williams, Sr. (Akiak, Lower River Subsistence) noticed only two other boats in his fishing spot below Akiak. He said that caught in a few hours he caught 100 reds, 2 chums, and 13 kings.

Like others, he noticed that people are not fishing as much and that there was no more combat fishing. He said that the challenge now is keeping fish dry so that they do not spoil. He has relatives in the Yukon area that have not been able to fish. He was wondering if there was a way to ship fish to them.

- Avery Hoffman (Bethel, KRITFC) fished almost the entire past opener and caught 13 kings, 73, reds, and 3 chums near Joe Pete's. He said that everyone he talked to did well, but that no one was catching many chums. He said that there were still reds jumping in the river. He noticed that people are starting to not fish as much.
- Mary Peltola (Bethel; 2nd Member at Large) fished for awhile during the Friday opening and said that her smokehouse was full. She also noticed that there were not many people out near where she fished near the Gweek. She was happy for the fish, but worried about the weather so far as drying and smoking goes.
- Middle River
 - No report given at this meeting.
- Upper River
 - Barbara Carlson (Sleetmute; Upriver Subsistence) stated that while she was gone the fishwheel ran during June and caught a few fish. Since she has been back the fishwheel has been running and they have not been catching many chums. She said that fishing has been good for reds and kings though. The kings have been good size and the reds have been getting larger.

 - Mackenzie Smith (NVN) stated that the Aniak Test Fish project has been operating
 well, but they have not seeing many chums. The Salmon River weir crew has arrived
 at the weir site and waiting for the water levels to go down
 - Subsistence Division Report
 - Dave Runfola (ADF&G) informed the group that the subsistence division had completed this year's field work for the non-salmon spawning tributaries project and that they would be working with analysts to review what was accomplished.
 - Working Group KRITFC Representative Report

- Sport Fish Report:
 - o John Chythlook (ADF&G) reported that most sport fishers and guides were currently focused on resident species and reporting difficulty with high water conditions.
