- 2001, motorized land vehicle means "a motorized vehicle operated on land, and includes hovercraft and airboats"
- 2001, boat means " a vehicle, vessel, or watercraft operated in or on water deep enough to float it at rest and includes hovercraft, airboats, personal watercraft, and amphibious vehicles"
- "Motorized-vehicles" means a motor-driven land, water, or air conveyance

- When adopted, most ATVs weighed less than 1,000 lbs, today ATVs weighing more than 1,000 lbs are most common
- The board has very few places where they restrict ATV use. Most restrictions are done in habitat regulations.

Create a definition of "general hunt"

Background

- Define "general hunt" as a hunt that is regulated in non-subsistence areas;
 - a regulated hunt that lays outside a nonsubsistence area, and the game being taken does not have a positive finding of customary and traditional use (C&T);
 - when the harvestable surplus is above the maximum amount necessary for subsistence (ANS) and the board has determined other uses can exist;
 - nonresident opportunity is a general hunt.

- Existing lead in language for each species in 5
 AAC 85 "In this section, the phrase 'General
 hunt only' means that there is a general hunt
 for residents, but no subsistence hunt, during
 the relevant open season."
- No definition of "general hunt" in 5 AAC
 92.990 definitions.

- Regulations already address nonresident hunts separately from residents, so including nonresident opportunity in the definition of "general hunt" is not necessary
- Hunts for some species could be clarified, such as black bears
- Hunt areas would have to be aligned with nonsubsistence areas

Brow tines

- "point" means any antler projection that is at least one inch long, and that is longer than it is wide, measured one inch or more from the tip;
- "tine" has the same meaning as point;

Antlers

- "50-inch antlers" means the antlers of a bull moose with a spread of 50 inches or more measured in a straight line perpendicular to the center line of the skull;
- "spike-fork antlers" means antlers of a bull moose with only one or two tines on at least one antler; for the purposes of this subparagraph, male calves are not considered spikefork bulls;
- "spike" means antlers of a bull moose with only one tine on at least one antler; for the purposes of this subparagraph, male calves are not considered spike bulls;

Desired change

 "spike-fork antlers" means antlers of a bull moose with only one or two tines on at least one antler, antler projections originating within two inches of the base of the antler and less than three inches in length will not be counted as a tine; male calves are not considered spike bulls;
