

Observed a large (approx. 20 lb) chinook salmon, in spawning coloration. The fish was moving upstream. The ~~area~~ habitat in the area was large rubble - to boulder. Habitat approx. two miles upriver changed to cobble and gravel substrate, appearing to be adequate spawning habitat, however, no fish were seen above this point.



