Islands Cabin Creek had lots of carcasses (couple hundred) and very few live fish. Home Cove main tributary has 226 live pinks and at least an equal number dead. Home Cove #2 (small) had 40 pinks in the intertidal area.

We then went to Beauty Bay. The tide was high so we couldn't tell if there was any oil. The Nuka River was glacial & we couldn't see if there were fish or not. Ferrum Creek held a few ( $\pm 10$ ) pinks.
