Comments: Location; Township 29S Range 37E Section NW 1/4 16 ; Latitude N59 degrees 24.459, Longitude W139 degrees 13.136 (NAD27). Stream is number 3 on the map.

Stream characteristics: Tributary to -10050. Stream is braided and influenced by surface runoff at times as well as braid of main Dangerous River. Width varies from .5 - .7m, depth from .3 -.6m. Substrate is mixed from sand and fine silt to clay. Overstory is mostly deciduous - cottonwood and willow. Seasonal rearing habitat, but juveniles were readily found throughout the reach. Area has been damaged by ATV traffic from vicinity of drill hole and airstrip, altering surface runoff pattern.

Stream surveys were part of the Yakutat Fish Habitat and ATV Trail Assessment project. Field crews surveyed streams for fish using baited minnow traps. Soak times for traps were usually less than 30 minutes per trap/ two traps per sample site. Captured fish were identified and released on-site. Field teams were comprised of ADF&G and Yakutat Ranger District personnel.


