The attached stream nomination form proposes the addition of king salmon to the species listed for Wheeler Creek on Admiralty Island. The nomination relies on information and observations by Paul Kissner.

When I worked in Angoon in the late 1970's, the old people told me about fishing camps at this creek for king salmon. Paul and Ron have not suggested an upstream point for king salmon distribution but I suspect it is above that shown on the map. Gabriel George may have additional information, as he did sample several streams in that area when he worked for the Forest Service, and he is familiar with hunting and fishing oral history.
