



Re: Forest Practices Inspection - Beaver Creek (SE-88-008)  
and Deer Bay (SE-86-010) Logging/Roading Operations

On May 15, 1990, Chris Kent and Jane Tonkin (ADEC), Chris Westwood (ADNR), Bruce Askren, you and I conducted a Forest Practices inspection at Sealaska logging and roading operations within the Beaver Creek and Deer Bay blocks. The results of that inspection are as follows:

Initially, we drove to Saltery Point to examine the log transfer facility, sort yard, and solid waste disposal sites. Precautions should be used to insure containment of all petroleum products near marine waters in the area.

Deer Bay Unit 21: Trees had been felled and partially yarded within this unit in spring of this year. Downhill yarding resulted in some visible skid roads. Water quality tributaries of cataloged stream #103-25-10200 should be cleaned of introduced material as an on-going process. The tower was set-up for yarding rather close to a water quality stream. A narrow buffer of standing timber was retained along the main stream.

Beaver Creek unit 405 (north & south portions): This unit adjoins Unit 21. Downhill yarding also occurred and two or three skid trails were evident. A slide occurred upslope of the 7200 Road within the north portion of Unit 405, but the toe was situated back from any watercourses. A baited minnow trap was fished for approximately 2 1/2 hours above a perceived barrier falls, approximately 400 feet upstream from the 7000 Road, along stream #10200. This resulted in the capture of three juvenile Dolly Varden char, assumed to be resident. This information will be conveyed as an anadromous waters atlas revision.



Unit 407/7000 Road (new); We drove to the east end of the 7000 road, within Unit 407. This road is along very steep side slopes (60-85%) along an approximately 1500 foot reach.

Caution must be exercised during cutting and yarding activities to keep timber out of the intertidal waters and habitat.

7400 Road: No new construction has occurred along this road, which is steeply upslope of Perry Creek (cataloged stream #103-25-10220). The initial 500 feet of road alignment is expected to be difficult and extreme care must be taken to keep material from sloughing downslope and possibly into Perry Creek. Please notify this office 48 hours prior to start-up of roading along this initial stretch of the 7400 Road, if pursued. Material in the steeper reaches of this roading must be endhauled to a stable location, away from watercourses. All material must be kept out of Perry creek.

With the recent signing of the Forest Practices legislation, effective immediately, the department requests the cessation of all logging activities within 66 feet of each stream bank along "Class A" (8% or less average slope) anadromous waterbodies. This office will avail itself to address questions you may have regarding this stream designation.

Other comments made during previous reviews of Forest Practices materials regarding this notification are still applicable.


