

As I stated in the attached memo, Sport Fish's file doesn't provide much detail in the headwaters area but it is some of the most important rearing habitat in Jordan Creek for coho. Currently, escapement is down from an average of 250-300 to about 20 because of habitat decline. We are reviewing a project in this area. It has been disturbed for many years. Ditches have been constructed for drainage that run directly into Jordan Creek. This part of Jordan Creek was likely a natural drainage before it was deepened. It has good groundwater upwelling and juvenile coho like it.

Bethers et al. (1995) doesn't provide capture data on the "west headwater" tributary. I caught 9 coho in a very short set time. On the Juneau B2 NW quad they don't even show a creek in this area but it is alongside the trailer park.
