


Eagle River (Stream No. 111-50-10070) Tributary Nomination

4	58.5356, -134.8016	Trap- 2 coho (50-60mm) 2 cutthroat trout (80mm) 1 Dolly Varden (80mm)
5	58.5359, -134.8008	Observed 1 adult chum. Trap- 4 coho (100-110mm) 20 Dolly Varden (100-120mm)
6	58.5362, -134.8003	Trap- 1 Dolly Varden (120-mm)
7	58.5366, -134.7994	Trap-empty
8	58.5366, -134.7988	End of our tracking, stream continues. No barriers between point #1 and point # 8

On 8-4-10 I tracked and trapped this tributary to Eagle River. This tributary appears to provide rearing and some spawning habitat. I placed a total of 6 minnow traps in this stream and caught 36 coho, 25 Dolly Varden, 2 cutthroat trout and observed 1 adult chum. There are no fish passage barriers between the confluence with Eagle River and my last point.
