




Goose Meadows Tributary – West Fork , AWC# 212-10-10010-2047

The western most tributary to Goose Meadows is a palustrine channel near its confluence with the main fork and a small upland wooded channel dominated with gravel substrate in its upper reaches. There is minimal water in its upper reaches and fish habitat peters out 0.5 km upstream of the wetland channel.

Five minnow traps were set along 0.2 km section for approximately 24 hours. Traps were set approximately 0.3 km upstream of the upper extent listed in the AWC. We caught 24 coho salmon (*Oncorhynchus kisutch*), and 1 coastal cutthroat trout (*Oncorhynchus clarkii*). We measured 6 coho salmon, 26% of the total catch. Coho salmon fork lengths ranged from 45 - 100 mm (mean 63.3 ± 15.7 mm). The cutthroat trout measured 75 mm.
