### EXPLANATION:

This emergency order establishes the schedule for the personal use dip net salmon fishery in the Chitina Subdistrict of the Upper Copper River through August 31, 1999. The Chitina Subdistrict will be open from 8:00 A.M. Friday June 11 until 8:00 P.M. Saturday June 12, and will be closed from Sunday June 13 through Tuesday June 15, and potentially reopen 12:00 P.M. Wednesday June 16 until 8:00 P.M. Sunday June 20. Tentative openings after this period are listed in the schedule below. Additional emergency orders may change this schedule based on actual numbers of fish passing the Miles Lake Sonar. After August 31, the fishery will remain open, by regulation, through September 30.

Salmon may be taken in the Chitina Subdistrict during the following time periods as established by emergency order:

Friday June 11, 8:00 A.M. to Saturday June 12, 8:00 P.M.

Wednesday June 16, noon to Sunday June 20, 8:00 P.M.

Monday June 21, noon to Sunday June 27, 8:00 P.M.

Wednesday June 30, 8:00 A.M. to Monday July 5, 8:00 P.M.

Wednesday July 7, noon to Sunday July 11, 8:00 P.M.

Wednesday July 14, 8:00 A.M. to Sunday August 22, 8:00 P.M.

Wednesday August 25, 8:00 A.M. to Tuesday August 31, 11:59 P.M.

Wednesday September 1, 12:00 A.M. to September 30, 11:59 P.M.

### REGULATION:

Consistent with the COPPER RIVER PERSONAL USE DIP NET SALMON FISHERY MANAGEMENT PLAN, 5 AAC 77.590 (b),

*“Salmon may be taken from June 1 through September 30. The department will establish, by emergency order, a preseason schedule for the period June 1 through August 31 based on daily projected sonar counts at the sonar counter located near Miles Lake. This abundance based schedule will distribute the harvest throughout the season. Adjustments will be made to the schedule inseason based on actual sonar counts compared to projected counts. When the actual sonar count at Miles Lake is more than the projected sonar count, additional fishing time will be announced by emergency order. If the actual sonar count at Miles Lake is less than the projected sonar count, fishing time will be reduced, by a corresponding percentage, by emergency order.”*

The following preseason schedule is established: the personal use dip net salmon fishery in the Chitina Subdistrict of the Upper Copper River area will be open from 8:00 A.M. Friday June 11 until 8:00 P.M. Saturday June 12, will be closed Sunday June 13 until Tuesday June 15, and reopen at 12:00 P.M Wednesday June 16 through 8:00 P.M. Sunday June 20. Openings after this period are listed in the schedule above. These openings may be increased or decreased by emergency order depending on the actual sonar counts at Miles Lake. After August 31, the fishery will remain open, by regulation, through September 30.

JUSTIFICATION:

As indicated above, the Department will establish a schedule for the fishery based on the pre-season projection of salmon passing the sonar station. This year the projected numbers of fish passing the sonar in the early portion of the run are low, thus in order to assure passage of adequate numbers of early run fish and to assure that available fish are adequate for the harvest potential, the fishing periods are restrictive. Increased participation in the personal use fishery during the past three years has increased the harvest potential and results in less time during fishing periods for the first six weeks of the fishery. As of May 31, the actual numbers of fish passing the sonar were low, therefore in order to assure adequate passage of early run salmon, the initial fishery opening is limited to 36 hours. Actual sonar counts at this time are mirroring the projected counts of eight days earlier suggesting the fish are late. This is likely a result of low water conditions and cooler than average temperatures in the Copper River drainage. However, the possibility still exists as the season progresses, if realized escapements improve, future openings may be increased accordingly.

Generally, harvest during the first opening is the lowest of the first 8 – 10 weeks of the fishery. This is likely due to low numbers of fish in the subdistrict at the time of the opening. This coupled with current low water conditions of the Copper River, could result in less than average harvests for the 1999 Copper River Personal Use Fishery opening.

As a reminder, the Copper River Personal Use Salmon fishery Management Plan and the Statewide Personal Use Regulations state that:

- Of the total bag limit only **four chinook salmon can be kept.**
- **Steelhead cannot be kept,** and must be returned to the water unharmed.
- When a harvestable surplus of 50,000 salmon or greater will be present in the Chitina Subdistrict, by emergency order, a supplemental permit for 10 additional sockeye salmon will be issued to personal use permit holders.
- The tips of the tail of personal use caught fish must be clipped **before** leaving the fishing site or concealing the fish from view.

**1999 COPPER RIVER PERSONAL USE DIP NET FISHERY OPENINGS  
ANNOUNCED**

The Chitina Subdistrict will be open for dipnetting salmon from 8:00 A.M. Friday June 11 until 8:00 P.M. Saturday June 12, and will be closed from Sunday June 13 through Tuesday June 15, and potentially reopen 12:00 P.M. Wednesday June 16 until 8:00 P.M. Sunday June 20. Tentative openings after this period are listed in the schedule below. Additional emergency orders may change this schedule based on actual numbers of fish passing the Miles Lake Sonar. After August 31, the fishery will remain open, by regulation, through September 30.

Salmon may be taken in the Chitina Subdistrict during the following time periods as established by emergency order:

Friday June 11, 8:00 A.M. to Saturday June 12, 8:00 P.M.  
Wednesday June 16, noon to Sunday June 20, 8:00 P.M.  
Monday June 21, noon to Sunday June 27, 8:00 P.M.  
Wednesday June 30, 8:00 A.M. to Monday July 5, 8:00 P.M.  
Wednesday July 7, noon to Sunday July 11, 8:00 P.M.  
Wednesday July 14, 8:00 A.M. to Sunday August 22, 8:00 P.M.  
Wednesday August 25, 8:00 A.M. to Tuesday August 31, 11:59 P.M.  
Wednesday September 1, 12:00 A.M. to September 30, 11:59 P.M.

As a reminder, the Copper River Personal Use Salmon fishery Management Plan and the Statewide Personal Use Regulations state that:

- Of the total bag limit only **four chinook salmon can be kept**.
- **Steelhead cannot be kept**, and must be returned to the water unharmed.
- When a harvestable surplus of 50,000 salmon or greater will be present in the Chitina Subdistrict, by emergency order, a supplemental permit for 10 additional sockeye salmon will be issued to personal use permit holders.

All residents of Alaska qualify to participate in this personal use fishery. A sport fishing license and a permit are required to participate in the personal use fishery. The permit fee is \$10.00. **Permits must be**

**acquired prior to fishing and are available at the ADF&G office 5 miles north of Chitina on the Chitina airport road. Office hours, on days the fishery is open, are 8:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m. Sundays through Thursdays, and 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. Fridays, and 8:00 a.m. to midnight Saturdays. The office will be open from noon to close on the day before the fishery opens. The office hours will be modified based on changes in the fishery schedule. The Chitina airport area is open to air travelers only, please keep off the airport parking pad and runway. Permits are also available from the Fairbanks Fish and Game office beginning May 24 during normal business hours.**

Immediately upon landing a salmon the personal use permit must be validated and the tips of the tail must be removed before leaving the fishing site or concealing the fish from view. At the end of each fishing trip the punch card portion of the permit must be returned to the Fish and Game office or the "drop box" near the office in Chitina. This card is on file at the Chitina office and available to the permit holder if he or she returns to fish again this season.

The fishery is operated by emergency order. Changes in these fishery openings will be announced at least 48 hours in advance. Information is available 24 hours each day at 822-5224 in Glennallen, 459-7382 in Fairbanks and 267-2511 in Anchorage
