## *Emergency Order*

### EXPLANATION:

This emergency order establishes a bag and possession limit of four king salmon with no size limit in a terminal saltwater location near Juneau and in freshwater drainages crossed by the Juneau road system that are open to sport fishing. This emergency order also allows the use of bait, weighted hooks and lures, use of multiple hooks with gap between point and shank larger than one-half inch, and the retention of king salmon hooked elsewhere than in the mouth (snagged) in the fresh waters of Fish Creek Pond on Douglas Island. King salmon caught in these salt and fresh waters do not count toward the nonresident annual limit.

### REGULATION:

Consistent with the stipulations within 5 AAC 47.055 Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management Plan, the provisions of 5 AAC 47.021 (d)(5)(A) and 5 AAC 47.023 (e)(1)(L&M) are added by this emergency order. Under this emergency order the following provisions are effective from 12:01A.M. Friday June 1, 2007 through Friday August 31, 2007:

#### **5 AAC 47.021. Special provisions for seasons, bag, possession, and size limits, and methods and means for the salt waters of Southeast Alaska Area.**

(d) In the Juneau vicinity:

(5) in the contiguous waters of Stephens Passage, Auke Bay, Fritz Cove and Gastineau Channel, enclosed on the west by a line running from the tip of Point Louisa to the navigational aid at the northern tip of Portland Island then along the eastern shore of Portland Island to its most southern point and ending on Douglas Island at the northern tip of Outer Point, and enclosed on the east by a line located approximately one-quarter mile south of the Dupont dock and extending across Gastineau Channel between department markers:

(A) the bag and possession limit for king salmon is four fish, no size limit; the nonresident annual limit for king salmon does not apply;

#### **5 AAC 47.023. Special provisions for seasons, bag, possession, and size limits, and methods and means for the fresh waters of the Southeast Alaska Area.**

(e) In the Juneau vicinity:

(1) in all drainages crossed by the Juneau City and Borough road system not closed to sport fishing,

(L) in the freshwater drainages open to sport fishing, the bag and possession limit for king salmon is four fish, no size limit. The nonresident annual limit for king salmon does not apply;

(M) in the fresh waters of Fish Creek Pond, the use of bait, weighted hooks and lures, and multiple hooks with a gap between point and shank larger than one-half inch are permitted. King salmon hooked elsewhere than in the mouth may be retained. The nonresident annual limit for king salmon does not apply;

JUSTIFICATION

The Alaska Board of Fisheries authorized the department to use its emergency order authority to harvest surplus hatchery produced king salmon in terminal harvest areas. Surplus hatchery king salmon are expected to return to the salt and fresh waters near Juneau, and over 500 king salmon are expected at Fish Creek on Douglas Island. Therefore, the department is increasing the king salmon bag and possession limits in the salt and fresh waters of the Juneau area and liberalizing methods and means in Fish Creek Pond.

The Southeast King Salmon Management Plan (5 AAC 47.055) authorizes the Department to repeal the nonresident angler annual limit provisions in hatchery terminal harvest areas.
