EXPLANATION:

This emergency order opens the Russian River Sanctuary Area to fishing for sockeye salmon at 8:00 a.m., Monday, June 18, 2007.

REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 57.122 SPECIAL PROVISIONS AND LOCALIZED ADDITIONS AND EXCEPTIONS TO THE SEASONS, BAG, POSSESSION, AND SIZE LIMITS, AND METHODS AND MEANS FOR THE MIDDLE SECTION OF THE KENAI RIVER DRAINAGE AREA (1) (D) are superceded by this emergency order. Under this emergency order, the following provisions are effective beginning at 8:00 a.m., Monday, June 18, 2007 through 11:59 p.m., Saturday July 14, 2007.

5 AAC 57.122 SPECIAL PROVISIONS AND LOCALIZED ADDITIONS AND EXCEPTIONS TO THE SEASONS, BAG, POSSESSION, AND SIZE LIMITS, AND METHODS AND MEANS FOR THE MIDDLE SECTION OF THE KENAI RIVER DRAINAGE AREA.

(1)(D) from JULY 15 – APRIL 30, The Russian River Sanctuary, including waters upstream from ADF&G regulatory markers located just downstream of the ferry crossing on the Kenai River to ADF&G regulatory markers located approximately 300 yards upstream of the public boat launch at Sportsman's Landing (including the waters around the upstream end of the island near the Russian River mouth) and the Russian River from its mouth upstream 100 yards to ADF&G regulatory markers is open to sport fishing from 8:00 a.m., Monday, June 18, 2007, through 11:59 p.m., Saturday, July 14, 2007.

JUSTIFICATION:

The department has determined the early run sockeye salmon spawning escapement goal of 14,000-37,000 fish at the Lower Russian Lake weir will be achieved. As of June 14, the count of the sockeye salmon escapement at the weir is 4,079. The initial escapement projection is approximately 44,000 early run Russian River sockeye salmon. Department staff estimate that a minimum of approximately 1,000 sockeye salmon are present in the Russian River from the weir extending downstream through the

Russian River falls to the closed fishing boundary above the recreational fishery. In addition, approximately 6,000 sockeye salmon are present in the Russian River Sanctuary Area. The early-run Russian River sockeye salmon escapement has exceeded the upper goal range for five of the last six years. Based on these observations and the daily numbers of sockeye salmon passing through the weir, it is appropriate to liberalize the fishery by allowing anglers the opportunity to harvest sockeye salmon in the Russian River Sanctuary Area.
