EXPLANATION: This emergency order increases the bag and possession limit for sockeye salmon in Redoubt Bay and Lake from four to six fish per day and in possession, consistent with 5 AAC 01.760. Redoubt Bay and Lake Sockeye Salmon Fisheries Management Plan.

REGULATION: The provisions of 5 AAC 47.021. Special provisions for seasons, bag, possession, and size limits, and methods and means for the salt waters of Southeast Alaska Area. (g)(5)(A) and 5 AAC 47.023. Special Provisions for waters; seasons; bag, possession, and size limits, and method and means for the fresh waters of the Southeast Alaska Area. (g)(9) are superseded by this emergency order. The following provisions are effective 12:01 a.m. July 16 through 11:59 p.m. December 31, 2014.

5 AAC 47.021. Special provisions to the waters; seasons; bag, possession, and size limits for the salt waters of Southeast Alaska Area.

(g) In the Sitka vicinity:

(5) (A) the bag and possession limit for sockeye salmon is six fish;

5 AAC 47.023. Special Provisions for waters; seasons; bag, possession, and size limits, and method and means for the fresh waters of the Southeast Alaska Area.

(g) In the Sitka vicinity

(9) in the Redoubt Lake drainage, the bag and possession limit for sockeye salmon is six fish.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Redoubt Bay and Lake Sockeye Salmon Management Plan (5 AAC 01.760.) provides management provisions for sport, subsistence, and commercial fisheries that harvest Redoubt Lake sockeye salmon based on an optimal escapement goal of 7,000 to 25,000 fish. The plan directs the department to increase the sockeye salmon bag and possession limit from four to six fish if the projected total escapement is greater than 30,000 sockeye salmon. As of July 14, 8,419 sockeye salmon had passed the Redoubt Lake weir. Based on previous years run timing, the 2014 escapement is projected to exceed 30,000 sockeye salmon. Therefore, the department is establishing a bag and possession limit of six sockeye salmon in Redoubt Bay and in the Redoubt Lake drainage, as directed under the management plan.
