



Upper Cook Inlet Personal Use Fisheries




Thank you for obtaining your Upper Cook Inlet Personal Use Salmon Fishery Permit!
Please read this flyer and be familiar with the personal use fishing regulations.
State or city land use regulations vary by location. It is your responsibility to follow them.

- This permit is required and must be with you when participating in the Kasilof set gillnet, Kasilof dipnet, Kenai dipnet, and Fish Creek dipnet fisheries.
- This is a household permit. Only obtain **one permit** per household.
- Only Alaska residents can participate in these fisheries.
- The total annual limit for all fisheries combined is 25 salmon and 10 flounder for the permit holder and 10 salmon for each additional household member. Household limits for Kings differ by fishery and are listed in the regulations and in annual emergency orders.
- Remove the tips of the tail fin prior to concealing your fish from plain view or transporting salmon from the fishing site.
- Record the date, location and the number of each species harvested on the permit. If dipping from a boat, record this information before leaving the area open to fishing. If dipping from shore, record this information before you leave the beach.
- **Return the permit to ADF&G no later than August 15th!**
Information on the permit is critical to manage these fisheries. Permits may be dropped off at an ADF&G office, mailed by attaching a postage stamp or reported online at <http://fish.alaska.gov/PU>.
- If you do not fish this season, fill in the "No" circle after the question asking if you fished and **report your harvest to ADF&G by August 15th.**
- Please stay off sensitive habitats such as coastal dunes and grasslands. Properly dispose of or pack out trash and be respectful of others.


Kasilof River Set-Gillnet (Left)

Open to both Shore and Boat Dipnetting



Kasilof River Dipnet
