



Salmon Lake drainage

Sport Fishing Regulations 2007-2008



Salmon Lake ➔ **BAIT PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES** ~ Only unbaited, artificial lures may be used.

Remainder of drainage ➔ **NO BAIT:** Nov. 16—Sept. 14
➔ **LIVE BAIT PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES**

SEASON Open year-round for all species except king salmon. The freshwater king salmon season is closed, but sometimes opens by emergency order. Check with Sitka ADF&G.

HARVEST AND SIZE LIMITS

Cutthroat and rainbow trout (in combination):

Salmon Lake ~ 2 daily, 2 in possession, 14-inch minimum and 22-inch maximum size limit.

Remainder of drainage ~2 daily, 2 in possession, 11-inch minimum and 22-inch max. size limit.

Steelhead: 1 daily, 2 in possession, 36-inch minimum size limit.
ANNUAL LIMIT of 2 fish.

Harvest record required ➔ ➔

Dolly Varden: 10 daily, 10 in possession; no size restrictions.

Coho, chum, pink, and sockeye (including kokanee) salmon:

16 inches or longer: 6 of each species daily, 12 of each species in possession
Less than 16 inches: a combined limit of 10 salmon daily, 10 in possession

A nontransferable HARVEST RECORD must be in possession of each person sport fishing for STEELHEAD in Southeast Alaska. A harvest record appears on the back of each sport fishing license. Anglers not required to have a sport fishing license can obtain a free harvest record card from ADF&G offices and license vendors in Southeast Alaska. Immediately upon landing a steelhead 36 inches or longer, you must enter the date and location of your catch, in ink, on the back of your sport fishing license or harvest record.

METHODS AND MEANS

Fish may NOT be taken in fresh water by means of: (1) fixed or weighted hooks and lures (except those of standard manufacture), (2) multiple hooks with a gap between point and shank larger than one-half inch, (3) spear, or (4) arrow.

It is unlawful to intentionally snag or attempt to snag any fish in fresh water. “Snag” means to hook a fish elsewhere than in its mouth. A fish unintentionally hooked elsewhere than in its mouth must be released immediately.
