FISH RESOURCE PERMIT  
(For Scientific/Educational Purposes)

to conduct the following activities from January 1, 2008 to December 31 2008 in accordance with AS 16.05.930:

**Purpose:** Cooperative Fisheries Research with Federal, ADF&G, and University of Alaska scientists to monitor population dynamics of salmonids in Sashin Creek at the Little Port Walter Marine Station on Baranof Island, and in the Auke Creek drainage on the Juneau road system.

**Location:** Sashin Creek at Little Port Walter on Baranof Island and Auke Creek on Juneau road system

**Species Collected:** All local species

**Method of Capture:** Weirs

**Final Disposition:** Auke Creek: Any number of fish may be counted and released.

All hatchery-reared chinook may be killed

Sashin Creek: Any number of fish may be counted and released.

All hatchery-reared chinook and steelhead may be killed.

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**REPORT DUE January 31, 2009.** The report shall include species, numbers, dates, and locations of collection and disposition, and if applicable, sex, age, and breeding condition, and lengths and weights of fish. A completion report detailing the results of any data analysis for the project, if not submitted with the collection report described above, must be submitted to the department within six months of the expiration of the permit. Data from such reports are considered public information. The report shall also include other information as may be required under the permit stipulations section.

**GENERAL CONDITIONS, EXCEPTIONS AND RESTRICTIONS**

1. This permit must be carried by person(s) specified during approved activities who shall show it on request to persons authorized to enforce Alaska's fish and game laws. This permit is nontransferable and will be revoked or renewal denied by the Commissioner of Fish and Game if the permittee violates any of its conditions, exceptions or restrictions. No redelegation of authority may be allowed under this permit unless specifically noted.
2. No specimens taken under authority hereof may be sold or bartered. All specimens must be deposited in a public museum or a public scientific or educational institution unless otherwise stated herein. Subpermittees shall not retain possession of live animals or other specimens.
3. The permittee shall keep records of all activities conducted under authority of this permit, available for inspection at all reasonable hours upon request of any authorized state enforcement officer.
4. Permits will not be renewed until the department has received detailed reports, as specified above.
5. UNLESS SPECIFICALLY STATED HEREIN, THIS PERMIT DOES NOT AUTHORIZE the exportation of specimens or the taking of specimens in areas otherwise closed to hunting and fishing; without appropriate licenses required by state regulations; during closed seasons; or in any manner, by any means, at any time not permitted by those regulations.

Employees and volunteers under the direct supervision of, and in the presence of, one of the authorized personnel listed above may participate in collecting activities under terms of this permit.

### **Permit Stipulations:**

- 1) The area management biologists, **Bob Chadwick** (747-5355; [bob.chadwick@alaska.gov](mailto:bob.chadwick@alaska.gov)) and **Brian Glynn** (465-4320; [brian.glynn@alaska.gov](mailto:brian.glynn@alaska.gov)) Juneau. have the right to specify methods for collecting, as well as limiting the collections of any species, and the number of specimens collected by time and area. Keep them informed regarding weir operations.
- 2) **Atlantic salmon** and other **non-native invasive aquatic species** encountered during sampling should be killed. In such an event, please contact the nearest ADF&G office (see # 1 above) ASAP with species identification or description, capture location or location of sighting if capture is not possible, number captured, size, and sex. Preserve and turn in the whole specimen to the nearest ADF&G office.
- 3) *A Title 41 Permit is required from Alaska Department of Natural Resources, Office of Habitat Management and Permitting, to place structures (weir, etc.) in streams.*
- 4) *A copy of this permit, including any amendments, must be made available at all field collection sites and project sites for inspection upon request by a representative of the department or a law enforcement officer.*
- 5) Issuance of this permit does not absolve the permittee from compliance in full with any and all other applicable federal, state, or local laws, regulations, or ordinances.
- 6) A **report of collecting activities**, referenced to this fish resource permit number, must be submitted to the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, Division of Sport Fish, P.O. Box 115525, Juneau, AK 99811-5525, attention Bob Piorkowski (465-6109; <mailto:Robert.Piorkowski@alaska.gov>), within 30 days after the expiration of this permit. This report must summarize sampling effort by date: the number of fish captured (if any) by location (GPS coordinates in the decimal degrees format (dd.ddddd)), and by species, and the fate of those fish. Fish length, weight, sex, and age data should be included if collected. A report is required whether or not collecting activities were undertaken. A report should also be sent to the Biologist(s) listed under stipulation number 1. A completion report detailing the results of any data analysis for the project, if not submitted with the collection report described above, must be submitted to the department within six months of the expiration of the permit. Data from such reports are considered public information.
