Gorge continues, mostly bedrock streambed, very steep gradient.

Distance about 1 mile to this point.

Much sign of recent streambed activity due to flooding.

Steep, narrow bedrock chute, probable end of accessible area.

Large pool - 8'D, 50x20

Velocity mostly torrential.

Steep cliffs to 60'. Few trees, some alder and devils club thickets.

Bedrock bank.

Gravel and trees pushed in a heap.

Cascade over bedrock, boulders. Several gravel bottomed pools.

Stream flows through a narrow gorge from here.

4' drop through a very narrow chute at bottom of cascade. Probably a barrier to pinks and chums.

3' falls.



Bedrock wall

Series of 2' terraces over bedrock, boulders. Few pools, some gravel suitable for spawning (10-20%)

Rapidly increasing gradient. Bottom mostly gravel to 6". Some good spawning in this 100 yd. stretch.

Massive log jam at end of gravel bar. Pushed up by floods. Much evidence of flooding i.e. pushed up gravel bars and trees above water level at time of survey.

Gravel cut bank

Gravel overflow area - some coho fry in pools.

Some moss on rocks in lower stream. Little upstream in the way of either moss or algae.

Looks like water level pretty high at time of survey from snow melt. Small grassy knolls under water at mouth.
