Trails & Survey Routes: very difficult walking on the stream banks due to thick
brush and logs; streambed looks as though it could be easily walked.

Aerial Survey Notes: the intertidal sections should be readily visible from the air.

Anchorage: in Kelly Cove or near the stream mouth in fair weather

Tide Stage when Surveyed: low

RESOURCES

COMMERCIAL FISHERIES (species, escapement, timing, spawning area):
pinks, chum and coho; both forks have good rearing for coho

Spawning Area: 300 meters²; intertidally (200'x25'x65%ASA)

Schooling Areas: at the mouth and in the pool below the falls

Spawning Areas: intertidally and an undetermined amount upstream (this area is not
expected to be large)

SHELLFISH POTENTIAL: a very large hardshell clam population inhabits the gravel
flats near the stream mouth

SPORT FISHERIES: limited by the small size of the stream

LAND USE (history, present, proposed): unknown; presently in a natural state

REHABILITATION POTENTIAL: salmon should be able to ascend the cascade without
too much difficulty

SOILS: generally stable

GAME RESOURCES (species, use, habitat): deer tracks on the beach; reportedly
a good furbearer area
