




Trails & Survey Routes: the stream is easily accessible by vehicle from Port Alice or skiff. All of the useable area is near the mouth.

Aerial Survey Notes: a very small stream, however, any fish would be readily visible unless they were under the bridge.

Anchorage: near the stream mouth.

Tide Stage when Surveyed: low

RESOURCES

COMMERCIAL FISHERIES (species, escapement, timing, spawning area):
A small number of pink salmon reportedly utilize this stream. No known escapement data. Spawning area: estimated at 10 M²

Schooling Areas: at the mouth.

Spawning Areas: above the bridge.

SHELLFISH POTENTIAL: dungeness crab reported to be present in Port Alice

SPORT FISHERIES: none.

LAND USE (history, present, proposed): this stream has been heavily impacted by logging activities. It's difficult to guess what the stream looked like before slash filled the upper stream and the gravel in the lower part pushed around by a bulldozer.

REHABILITATION POTENTIAL: Stream is too small to justify major rehabilitation.
