GOOD TROUT FISHING AT GREEN LAKE

A recent survey conducted by Roger D. Wadman, Regional Sport Fish Biologist, disclosed Green Lake to be an excellent location for brook trout sport fishing.

Green Lake is located at the east end of Silver Bay, 9.5 miles by water from Sitka. It is reached by hiking a short U. S. Forest Service trail located to the left of the outlet stream.

The survey revealed the lake to be amply populated with large eastern brook trout. As there are falls shortly above salt water, no other fish inhabit the system. The survey further revealed the brook trout to be feeding on the bottom at depth of 10 to 20 feet. Many fish were found in the vicinity of a bar which crosses the middle of the lake and also in the vicinity of the inlet streams.

A boat was furnished for Green Lake by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game. Transporting the boat to the lake was accomplished by a helicopter furnished by the U. S. Forest Service.
