HASSELBORG LAKE TO DISTIN LAKE (1-2 days)

The trail from Hasselborg Lake to Lake Guerin is about 1.7 miles long and in good condition since it was cleared in the summer of 1971. [3] It is not marked from the Lake Guerin, or west, side, but at the northeast corner of the lake the trailhead is identified by a shed in its death throes.

The trail climbs gently 200-300 feet above the lakes before gradually dropping again to Lake Guerin, 12 feet higher than Hasselborg Lake. It stays within forest most of the time except for one spot. There are two or
