Le Duc Lake of 704 acres is situated on the mainland in the Chickamin River drainage on back Behm Canal above the mouth of the LeDuc Fork at an elevation of 1384 ft. This lake is quite deep (not sounded but est. over 300 ft.) and the water is very clear. The drainage area is 4563 acres. It is a typical alpine type lake with very steep bedrock sides, a gravel and sand beach at the head and a bedrock dike holding the lake level over which the outlet flows. The water is quite soft and near neutral. Access is by float-plane after ice-out in mid-July. This lake was planted with 10,000 steelhead fry in 1955. An excellent population of rainbow trout has resulted.

Knowing that there was a good number of fish in the lake, only one net was set for 3 days to take a fish sample. The catch was 13 fish in the net. The outlet was also sampled in the pool below the first barrier falls down from the lake and 6 fish were taken in a matter of minutes with sport gear. All the fish ranged in length from 7.75 in. to 15.25 inches. The larger fish showed 1 or 2 spawn checks on the scales and ages varied from 1 to 5 years. An excellent self-maintaining population has resulted here that receives some patronage by Ketchikan anglers. The lack of camping facilities discourages many anglers.
