December 23, 1963

Project No. 2307 license

Article 32 - Licensee to construct, maintain and operate recreation facilities. Licensee within one year to file for approval recreation plan after consultation with appropriate Federal, State and local agencies.

December 27, 1964

AJ letter to FPC San Francisco

→ Recreation plan discussed with Vince Olson, FS.

When plan approved will install

Forest Service has no jurisdiction over Salmon Lake.

Mr. Leach says Department of Natural Resources will not require recreational facilities at that time. If required later, AJ will submit plans to FPC for prior approval.

July 1, 1966 ± (FPC)

Quinton Engineers Ltd. recreation plan. R-1 and R-2 describe picnic and camping facilities.

October 3, 1966

Forest Service Juneau to FS Washington. Recommend A-frame cabin, AJ to provide and maintain.

July 9, 1967

FS reply to FPC September 6, 1966 letter.

Proposed standard A-frame cabin at Annex Lake with administration and maintenance by Forest Service.

August 3, 1967

AJ letter to FPC

Backs off even from initial R-1 and R-2 proposals on basis of vandalism and limited probable use.

September 5, 1967

FWS(BCF) draft of reply to Secretary of Interior furnished Juneau FS.

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Proposes Secretary recommend to FPC A-frame cabins at Salmon Lake and Annex Lake following consultation with Bureau of Outdoor Recreation. Says Division of Lands and FS agree.

September 13, 1967	FS Juneau to FS Washington re AJ August 3, 1967 letter.
→	Reaffirms FS to FPC June 9, 1967 letter. States local office FWS & Seattle BOR are recommending Annex Lake and Salmon Lake facilities.
→	Salmon Lake is administered by Alaska Department of Natural Resources.
September 17, 1968	Order concerning recreational use plan & modifying license.
→	Reviewed AJ recreational Proposal (R-1, R-2) and AJ arguments against Interior-FS proposals. Noted Interior proposal of heavier cabin. Ordered construction of cabins as approved by FS and Department of Natural Resources and submission within 60 days revised recreational plan, etc.
October 9, 1968	AJ letter to FPC requesting rehearing.
November 5, 1968	Detailed protest.
January 28, 1969	FPC order granting rehearing.
April 2, 1969	FPC letter to FS re rehearing. Would FS present evidence on position.
→	FS letter to FPC.
April 15, 1969	Rebuts AJ October 9, 1968 points.
→	States FS would like to try again to work out a mutually satisfactory solution with licensee before hearing.
→	BCF Juneau to BCF Washington.
→	Transmits draft of Secretary reply to FPC and answers to questions.
→	States they have deleted request for cabin and boat at Salmon Lake.
	No arrangement yet for administration and maintenance of Salmon Lake.
	Says State of Alaska not preparing comments as they have not received notice of rehearing.

May 12, 1969	FS Juneau advised . Washington, satisfactory agreement has not been worked out.
May 14, 1969	Forest Service (North Tongass) to AJ re Annex Lake. Have been requested to report on rehearing petition September 17, 1968 order. Recreational facilities minimum. \$4,000 cost instead of AJ \$9,680. Vandalism would not be problem.
May 27, 1969	AJ letter to FPC re FS April 21, 1969 letter. Vandalism--threat to Annex power operation. Costs Juneau Borough Chairman and attorney favor outdoor recreation, but oppose adding costs to electric rate payers. Rate request opposition by Juneau still unsettled.
June 4, 1969	AJ reply to North Tongass FS--NO
July 17, 1969	Interior further reply to FPC Jan 23, 1969 letter. September 17, 1968 order approved AJ recreation plan with addition of 1 cabin at each lake. AJ requested FPC withdraw order or adopt AJ plan.
	Interior agrees to delete cabin at Salmon Lake use FS cabin at Annex Lake, and urges 3 wall shelter at Salmon Lake.
	Endorse Forest Service \$4,000 estimate.
	Recommend recreation plan be updated periodically (biennial submission) with Federal, State and local agencies.
	Believe costs not large enough to impose economic hardship.
	Hope AJ will agree
	If hearing or other arrangement for testimony necessary will be glad to submit written testimony by Interior field representatives in Juneau.
September 15, 1969	FS Juneau to FS Washington.

AJ reply to FPC re Interior July 17, 1969 letter.



Since FPC has not set matter for rehearing and AJ is not requesting one, interpret FPC request as for AJ position.
