

Wolf Lake is of 121 acres on Prince of Wales Island between Hollis and Karta River. It lies at an elevation of 1175 ft. and drains into 12 Mile Arm of Kasaan Bay. Many falls in the outlet are impassable for fish. The area surrounding the lake is sub-alpine with considerable open alpine area above. The drainage is 960 acres. The shoreline is largely quite steep with bedrock making up most of it. There is an alluvial fill at the head of the lake which is permeable to the point of the inlet stream "going underground" at normal average flows. The outlet has good spawning ground also. The lake was stocked in 1963 with rainbow fry. The water carries a little muskeg color. Access presently is by float plane.

Two nets were fished in this lake for 3 days and lifted July 18. They held 7 rainbow trout 6.5 to 11 inches long. The fish have established a sustaining population which should become popular with Ketchikan anglers.

Wolf Lake - A 109 acre lake at elevation 1100 feet on Prince of Wales Island between Karta Bay and Hollis. This lake was planted with rainbow in 1963 and had never been checked since. The visit on August 4 disclosed rainbows in good number. The lake should become popular with fly-in anglers.
