


## ENTRY RULES FOR 2005-2006 ALASKA WATER EDUCATION POSTER CONTEST

\*Artwork must not be smaller than 8 ½ by 11 inches, and no larger than 24 by 30 inches overall, including mat. Artwork can be any shape, however, artwork that is irregularly shaped must be matted. A mat is not required except when art is irregularly shaped, but students and teachers may choose to mat any artwork they wish. Please see the following examples:



\*Artwork can be any media (ink, pencil, charcoal, watercolor, etc) except photography, and may be multimedia.

\*Entries will be judged on the basis of creative thought, sound principles, and artistic rendition. Teacher and parental input is acceptable in development of the theme and principals upon which the artwork is based, but such assistance must result in the student's understanding of the end thoughts and principles.

\*The artistic rendition must be accomplished solely by the student. Teachers and parents may instruct and demonstrate, but may not participate otherwise in the rendition.

\*Combined entries resulting from cooperative efforts of two or more students are not eligible.

\*Teachers are responsible for judging at the classroom level. They may request assistance from PTA volunteers, community artists, and/or local “water experts.”

\*Each elementary school may submit only one poster per each grade (3-6) e.g. a maximum of three entries from an individual school (one per grade).

\*Each entry **must** have a completed official entry form taped, glued, or otherwise attached to the back of the artwork.

\*Entries become the property of the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) and may be retained for up to one year to be used by ADF&G and its agents for educational purposes. Permission is granted to duplicate artwork and/or a picture of the student, and to use these or their facsimiles for educational purposes, including fundraising with no expectation of remuneration for an indefinite period of time. The ADF&G can make no guarantee against damage or loss of any contestant entry. Care will be taken to safeguard the artwork. Submission of artwork constitutes acceptance of these conditions and entry rules.

\*Entrants give their permission to post their work and photos on the Internet and in publicity media.

\*Entries will be returned to the submitting school, but schools will be responsible for returning individual entries to students.

\*Students receiving cash prizes for winning entries, and their sponsoring schools, will provide a brief summary to the contest coordinator on what they purchased with their cash prize.
