Prince William Sound Salmon Fishery Announcement #18

COPPER RIVER DISTRICT: The Copper River District will open at 7:00 am on Monday, June 28 for a 24-hour commercial drift gillnet fishing period. Waters within the **standard Chinook salmon inside closure area** will be **CLOSED** during this fishing period. Daily and cumulative passage at the Miles Lake sonar station indicates that the inriver goal is likely to be met and supports opening the Copper River District commercial fishery. Copper River District Chinook salmon average harvest timing (2011-2020) is 98% complete through this date. The continued closure of the standard Chinook salmon inside closure area is in response to Chinook salmon subsistence and sport harvest restrictions (no retention).

During the commercial fishing season, subsistence harvest may occur in the Copper River District concurrent in time and area with commercial fishing periods until the Copper River District is closed at the end of the season. Additionally, waters of the Copper River District, excluding the standard Chinook salmon inside closure area, will open to subsistence fishing from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm on all Saturdays between June 24 and October 31.

The **standard Chinook salmon inside closure area** will be defined as waters north of a line connecting the following points:

The grass bank marker line is defined in 5AAC 24.350(1)(A) with the exception of this year's extension of the closure line across Little Softuk (**see bold font below**). This closure line is defined with the following points:

Waters north of this line, within sloughs, and in Boswell Bay within the bay (5 AAC 24.350 (1)(A)) are closed to commercial and subsistence salmon fishing during all periods.

Subsistence users may obtain subsistence permits during regular business hours. Prince William Sound Management Area salmon subsistence permits may be obtained through any ADF&G office or online (<https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Store/>). **In Cordova, permits will be available during normal business hours Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.** ADF&G staff will not be available to issue permits before hours, after hours, on state holidays, or on weekends. **Permit holders are encouraged to call the Cordova office at 907-424-3212 or report online (<https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Harvest/>) to provide preliminary harvest reports to assist with inseason harvest tracking.**

Cumulative sonar count through 6/25 is 442,585 fish, whereas 387,937 fish are projected by this date to meet the Inriver Run Goal. The 0600 count for 6/26 is 1,685 fish. For the week ending June 19, the Copper River Delta survey count was 17,720 sockeye salmon versus an anticipated range of 14,273 – 33,736. The Copper River District harvest for the 24-hour fishing period that started on Thursday, June 24 was 12,500 sockeye and 48 Chinook salmon with 82 deliveries reported.

BERING RIVER DISTRICT: The Bering River District will remain closed to commercial fishing. For the week ending June 19, the Bering River Delta survey count was 610 sockeye salmon versus an anticipated range of 3,251 – 7,153.

COGHILL DISTRICT: The Coghill District, excluding waters of the Esther and Granite Bay subdistricts and waters of the WNH SHA and THA, will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 28. **Waters of Granite Bay Subdistrict, within Esther Passage and on the western side of Esther Island north of 60° 52.66' N., including waters of Granite Bay, will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 12-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 28. Regulatory closed waters within Granite Bay Subdistrict will not be in effect for this fishing period. Waters of Port Wells and College Fiord, north of 60° 55.81' N., and east of a line from Pakenham Point (61° 00.45' N., 148° 04.85' W.) to 60° 55.81' N., 148° 10.92' W., will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 48-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 28.** Preliminary harvest estimates from the 48-hour period that started on Thursday, June 24 are 98,700 chum and 6,200 sockeye salmon with 282 deliveries reported. As of June 24, 5,290 sockeye salmon have passed the Coghill River weir versus a cumulative anticipated range of 2,058 – 6,175 fish. The Coghill River is currently experiencing a high-water event and salmon are not currently being counted through the weir.

PWSAC requests that the Esther Subdistrict, the Granite Bay Subdistrict, and the WNH SHA and THA remain closed for all or a portion of the 48-hour commercial fishing period commencing on Monday, June 28. Cost recovery fishing has started at WNH and will continue as run entry and hatchery escapement warrants. **In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.**

ESHAMY DISTRICT: The Eshamy District, **north of 60°34.25'N, including Foul Bay, and south of 60°32.00'N,** will open to commercial gillnet harvest for a 12-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June

28. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 12-hour period that started on Thursday, June 24 were 12,600 chum and 27,200 sockeye salmon with 244 deliveries reported.

PWSAC requests that the Main Bay Subdistrict remain closed for the entirety of the 12-hour commercial fishing period commencing on Monday, June 28. Cost recovery harvests will continue in the Main Bay Subdistrict as run entry and hatchery escapement warrants. **In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.**

UNAKWIK DISTRICT: The Unakwik District will open to commercial drift gillnet and purse seine harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 28.

SEINE FISHERIES: VFDA made two sets inside Port Valdez on Thursday, June 24, for a total of 34 pink salmon. Test fishing will resume today.

An aerial survey of Simpson Bay, Sheep Bay, Port Gravina, Port Fidalgo, and Galena Bay was conducted on June 22. Stream escapement observations were minimal during these surveys, which is to be expected for the date. Current indices of escapement and run entry do not support a purse seine CPF targeting wild stocks in the Eastern District. The next aerial survey of the Eastern District is expected to occur early next week.

MONTAGUE DISTRICT: The Port Chalmers Subdistrict, **east of Channel Island, north of a line from 60° 9.52'N., 147° 22.38'W. to 60° 14.25'N., 147° 23.11'W, and east of a line from 60° 14.58'N., 147° 22.22'W. to 60° 20.00'N., 147° 14.30'W.,** will open to purse seine fishing for 48 hours beginning at 8:00 am on Monday, June 28 with additional 36-hour periods at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 1, and 8:00 am on Saturday, July 3. A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice.

Regulatory closed waters and anadromous stream closures within the Port Chalmers Subdistrict will not be in effect until further notice. A total of 320,000 chum salmon are forecast to return to Port Chalmers. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that ended on Friday, June 25 was 20,644 chum salmon with 30 deliveries reported. Contribution estimates from the period ending Wednesday, June 23 was 93% Port Chalmers and 7% WNH.

SOUTHWESTERN DISTRICT: The AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will open to purse seine fishing for **24 hours beginning at 8:00 am on Monday, June 28 with additional 24-hour periods at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 1, and 8:00 am on Saturday, July 3.** A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Regulatory closed waters and anadromous stream closures within the AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will not be in effect until further notice.** A total of 150,000 chum salmon are forecast to return to AFK Hatchery. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 24-hour period that ended on Friday, June 25 was 28,621 chum salmon, and 5,562 sockeye salmon with 37 deliveries reported. Chum salmon contribution estimates from the period ending Wednesday, June 23 was 88% AFK, 11% WNH, 4%, and 1% wild. Sockeye salmon contribution estimates from the period ending Wednesday, June 23 was 96% MBH, and 4% wild.

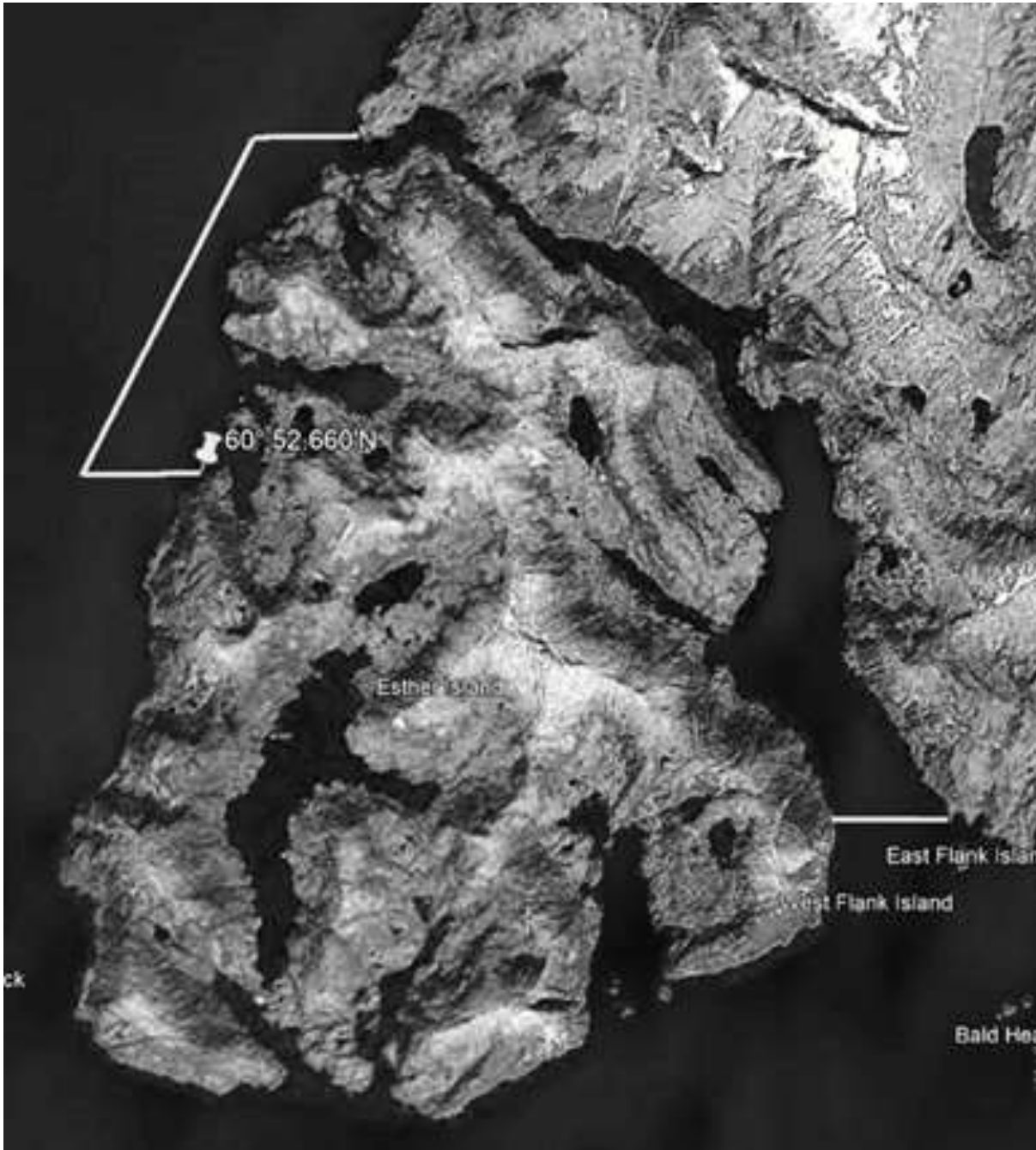

Unless otherwise specified, all openings are clock openings based on Alaska Daylight Time, which is based on Coordinated Universal Time and may be obtained by calling 303-499-7111.

The department encourages commercial permit holders to renew their licenses early and to check their CFEC vessel registration stickers to make sure they are current.

The department also encourages permit holders to report observed violations to Wildlife Safeguard at 800-478-3377. Reports are anonymous and cash rewards may be paid for successful prosecution of violations.
