Section 1-B: will be open from 12:01 p.m., Sunday, September 12, through 12:00 noon, Thursday, September 16, 2021, with the following restriction:

Pearse and Portland Canals: will be closed north of the latitude of Akeku Point at 54°50.03′ N lat.

District 6: will be open from 12:01 p.m., Sunday, September 12, through 12:00 noon, Wednesday, September 15, 2021, with the following restriction:
