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# **Lower Cook Inlet Salmon Fishery Advisory Announcement #1**

**SOUTHERN DISTRICT:** Set gillnet: Effective Monday, June 3 specific waters of the Southern District identified in 5AAC 21.330(b)(1) including the Port Graham Subdistrict, will open to commercial set gillnet harvest on a regular schedule of two 48-hour fishing periods per week beginning at 6:00 AM on Mondays and Thursdays as defined in 5AAC 21.320(a)(3).




Figure 1.- Example fish ticket for dual, (aka "stacked") Lower Cook Inlet commercial set gillnet permit holders showing serial numbers from both Area H commercial CFEC set gillnet permits documented.

Commercial set gillnet fishermen in Lower Cook Inlet that have dual, (aka "stacked") Area H Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC) permits are reminded that the serial numbers for both permits are required to be documented on each fish ticket submitted regardless of the quantity of gear used. An example of this is shown in Figure 1 on page two of this announcement.

**Purse seine:** Portions of the Southern District are anticipated to open to commercial seine harvest on Monday, June 10.

**EASTERN DISTRICT:** Cook Inlet Aquaculture Association (CIAA) projects 111,500 hatchery released sockeye salmon will return to Resurrection Bay in 2024. Eighty-nine thousand of these fish will be targeted for cost recovery harvest and 12,200 are needed for escapement and broodstock. Approximately 10,000 fish are anticipated to be surplus to these needs and may be available for common property harvest. Cost recovery operations will be voluntarily suspended within 100 feet of the water's edge in the Spring Creek area from the Seward Ships Drydock, north to the area of the sawdust pile from 6:00 AM to 10:00 PM, 7 days per week.

**KAMISHAK DISTRICT:** Portions of the Kamishak District are anticipated to open to commercial harvest in July based on aerial survey documentation of pink and chum salmon in index streams in those areas. The Chenik Subdistrict is anticipated to open to commercial harvest in late June targeting returns to Chenik Lake. Sockeye salmon passage into Chenik Lake will be monitored in real time using video relayed from that location using satellites.

<u>OUTER DISTRICT</u>: Western portions of the Outer District may open in late July based on aerial survey observations. The Delight Lake weir will not be operated in 2024 due to budgetary shortfalls. Escapement to Delight Lake will be monitored using aerial surveys. The 2024 anticipated Outer District pink salmon harvest is 398,300 fish. Commercial pink salmon harvest from this district in 2022 was 324,836, in 2020 was 1.6 million fish, and in 2018 was 32,326 fish.
