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UPPER COOK INLET COMMERCIAL FISHING ANNOUNCEMENT No. 28
EMERGENCY ORDER NUMBER 2-F-H-31-24

Commercial salmon fishing with drift gillnets will be open in State of Alaska waters of the Expanded Kenai section and Expanded Kasilof section of the Upper Subdistrict from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 14, 2024.

Drift gillnet fishing is prohibited within 2-miles of the Kenai Peninsula shoreline in compliance with the *Kenai River Late-run King Salmon Stock of Concern Management Plan (5 AAC 21.382)*.

Through July 11, the cumulative sockeye salmon escapement estimate for the Kasilof River was 432,076 fish and the current mean run timing projection of escapement is approximately 1,100,000 sockeye salmon which exceeds the biological escapement goal of 140,000–320,000 sockeye salmon. Through July 11, the cumulative sockeye salmon escapement estimate for the Kenai River was 286,232 fish and the current mean run timing projection of escapement is approximately 3,400,000 sockeye salmon which exceeds the inriver goal of 1,100,000–1,400,000 sockeye salmon. Elevated commercial catch rates in recent commercial fishing periods indicate a high presence of fish in the district. This commercial fishing period is warranted to harvest abundant sockeye salmon.

Fishermen and processors are reminded of the legal requirement to report all commercially harvested salmon on a fish ticket, whether sold or kept for personal use (5 AAC 39.130(c)(7)). Fish harvested in the drift gillnet fishery during the July 14 fishing period should be reported in statistical area 244-56.

This announcement **DOES NOT** open the federal waters of Upper Cook Inlet. Please contact NOAA regarding fishing opportunity in the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) and federal fishery regulations at the NOAA Sustainable Fisheries Division at (907) 586-7228.
