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Lower Cook Inlet Salmon Fishery Advisory Announcement #9

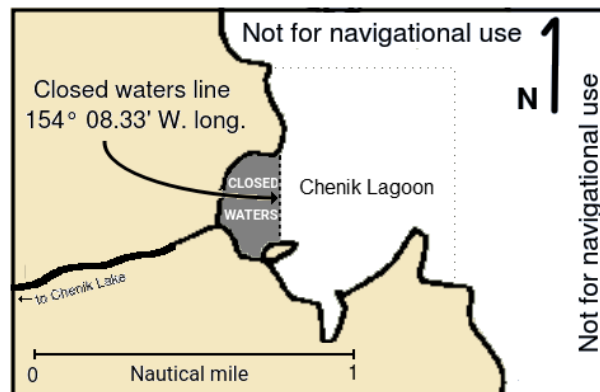


Figure 1.- Chenik Lagoon, west of 154° 08.33' W. long. is closed.

KAMISHAK DISTRICT: The Chenik Subdistrict including the portion of Chenik Lagoon east of 154° 08.33' W. long. (Figure 1) will open for three 14-hour fishing periods on the following days,

- on Monday, July 13 from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM,
- on Tuesday, July 14 from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM, and
- on Wednesday, July 15 from 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM.

Remaining subdistricts of the Kamishak District, excluding the McNeil River Subdistrict, the Paint River Subdistrict, and the Kirschner Lake special harvest area remain open to commercial salmon harvest. Fishing periods are 7-days per week, 24-hours per day. Sockeye salmon escapement into Chenik Lake is posted here:

SOUTHERN DISTRICT: Set gillnet: Waters of the Southern District identified in 5AAC 21.330(b)(1) remain open to commercial set gillnet harvest on a regular schedule of two 48-hour fishing periods per week beginning at 6:00 AM on Mondays and Thursdays as defined in 5AAC 21.320(a)(3). Harvest from set gillnet fishing periods to date is shown below,

Purse seine: In the Southern District, waters in the vicinity of Coal Point as defined by a rectangle between the following points, 59° 36.43' N. lat., 151° 25.36' W. long., 59° 36.43' N. lat., 151° 23.65' W. long., 59° 35.57' N. lat., 151° 23.65' W. long., and 59° 35.57' N. lat., 151° 25.36' W. longitude will **remain closed** to commercial salmon harvest.

The following areas remain open on a schedule of Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 16-hour commercial fishing periods beginning at 6:00 AM on those days,

- the Halibut Cove Subdistrict,
- the Tutka Bay Subdistrict, excluding the Tutka Bay Hatchery special harvest area (SHA), and
- the Neptune Bay and China Poot Bay sections, excluding the Hazel Lake and China Poot SHAs.

The Northshore Subdistrict and all other areas of the Southern District remain closed to commercial purse seine salmon harvest. Seine harvest through July 8 from the Southern District is approximately 54,000 sockeye, 60 Chinook, 150 chum, 150 pink, and 1 coho salmon.

EASTERN DISTRICT: The Resurrection Bay Subdistrict will close to commercial salmon harvest at 10:00 PM on Friday, July 10 for the 2026 season.

Effective at 6:00 AM on Monday July 13, waters of the Aialik Bay Subdistrict including the waters of Peterson Lagoon, south of 59° 53.84' N. latitude, are open on a 7-day per week schedule of 6:00 AM to 10:00 PM 16-hour fishing periods.

As a reminder, unless otherwise specified in regulation or by emergency order, commercial fishing for salmon is prohibited at all times within 500 yards of the fresh water of a salmon stream and over the beds or channels of streams and rivers at all stages of the tide. Fresh water is considered separated from salt water, at the mouth of streams and rivers, by a line drawn between the seaward extremities of the exposed tideland banks at the present stage of the tide, (5AAC 39.975(a)(26)).

The next scheduled commercial salmon fisheries announcement is anticipated to be on Friday, July 17.
