KODIAK COMMERCIAL SALMON FISHERY ANNOUNCEMENT # 38 For Emergency Order #4-FS-K-38-15

The Inner Karluk Section of the Southwest Kodiak District <u>will remain open</u> to commercial salmon fishing **until further notice**. (Waters will be open to normal closed waters as described in regulation).

As Previously Announced:

The following areas <u>will close</u> to commercial salmon fishing at 6:00 p.m. Monday, August 31:

- The Northeast Kodiak District;
- The Eastside Kodiak District;
- The Mainland District;
- The Northwest Afognak, Northeast Afognak, Southeast Afognak, and Raspberry Strait sections of the Afognak District; and
- The Humpy-Deadman Section of the Alitak District.

The following areas **<u>will remain open</u>** to commercial salmon fishing **until further notice**:

- The Northwest Kodiak District;
- The Southwest Afognak, Izhut Bay, Duck Bay, and Outer Kitoi Bay sections of the Afognak District; and
- The Outer Karluk, Sturgeon, Halibut Bay, and Outer Ayakulik sections of the Southwest Kodiak District.

Chinook (king) salmon 28 inches or greater in length may not be retained by purse seine gear in the commercial fishery and must be returned to the water unharmed in that portion of the Northwest Kodiak and Southwest Kodiak districts south of the latitude of Cape Kuliuk, until further notice.

Closed waters are as shown on the Kodiak Area Salmon Statistical Chart and detailed in the Commercial Salmon Fishing Regulations (5AAC 18.350).
